They might also bake a cake to show off their skills and share when they got home. It has become an occasion for honouring mothers and giving them presents.

Bible Readings

Exodus 2.1-10

Now a man from the house of Levi went and married a Levite woman. The woman conceived and bore a son; and when she saw that he was a fine baby, she hid him for three months. When she could hide him no longer she got a papyrus basket for him, and plastered it with bitumen and pitch; she put the child in it and placed it among the reeds on the bank of the river. His sister stood at a distance, to see what would happen to him.

The daughter of Pharaoh came down to bathe at the river, while her attendants walked beside the river. She saw the basket among the reeds and sent her maid to bring it. When she opened it, she saw the child. He was crying, and she took pity on him. 'This must be one of the Hebrews' children,' she said. Then his sister said to Pharaoh's daughter, 'Shall I go and get you a nurse from the Hebrew women to nurse the child for you?' Pharaoh's daughter said to her, 'Yes.' So the girl went and called the child's mother. Pharaoh's daughter said to her, 'Take this child and nurse it for me, and I will give you your wages.' So the woman took the child and nursed it. When the child grew up, she brought him to Pharaoh's daughter, and she took him as her son. She named him Moses, 'because', she said, 'I drew him out of the water.'

After the Bible reading the reader may say

2 Corinthians 1:3-7



Are you sitting comfortably? Then I'll begin.

I wonder how many of you remember that? Waiting avidly for the beginning of *Listen with Mother*. For those of you who are too young to remember, this was a programme on the radio with stories and songs just right for little children not yet at school. It was time to snuggle comfortably up to Mum and be quiet for a bit after lunch.

In the Levite household we heard about, I don't suppose that Jochebed's new baby would have had the chance of snuggling comfortably next to Mum too often. They were so scared that he would be discovered by Pharaoh's men and killed.

I wonder how Jochebed felt about that.

I wonder how her daughter, Miriam, felt about it.

I wonder if they were able to comfort one another in their troubles. Consoling one another as they contemplated what might happen to the baby, a son and brother. Sharing each other's fears.

Concealed for three months and then too big to hide any longer, they hid him one last time in a basket in a river. A desperate move, but one which God honoured. The baby, Moses as he was subsequently named, was found and saved. Not only that he was returned to his mother as wet nurse. So perhaps he did get to snuggle up comfortably with Mum after all.

A thousand and more years later, and another new baby.

I wonder just how Mary felt in Jerusalem listening to Simeon. She had gone to the temple, as was the custom, forty days after giving birth to give thanks to God for baby Jesus and to sacrifice two doves to redeem her first born. A moment of joy, excitement even, as they did for their firstborn what had been done for centuries in their tradition. Mary had been amazed, amongst all the other amazing things surrounding Jesus' birth, and no wonder. But I don't suppose that she was particularly comforted when she heard what Simeon had to say:

“This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed—and a sword will pierce your own soul too.”

Just what was going to happen in the future to Jesus?

I wonder if Joseph put his arms round Mary, spoke words of reassurance to her about their new baby boy; assuring her that they would face these troubles together. I wonder if she felt God's presence closely with her then as it had been when she discovered that she was to bear His son. Her confidence in God enabling her to say yes at the outset of all this.

I wonder what these two stories have to say to us as we face our own troubles, particularly the unknown outcome of the coronavirus pandemic. Perhaps we are anxious; fearful for ourselves and our families. We don't know what life will look like in a few months' time, or at the end of the year, or further into the future.

As Christians we aren't promised a comfortable life but if we face difficulties we are promised that we will be comforted as we struggle.

The prophet Isaiah tells us: *For thus says our God, "As a mother comforts her children, so I will comfort you; You shall see and your heart shall rejoice"*

St Paul reminds us of much the same thing: *we know that God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, is the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort. We know that it is he who comforts us in all our troubles.*

God's comfort, though, isn't just so that we can feel snuggled up and comfortable in ourselves. It is in order that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God.

At this difficult time, let's try to open ourselves to God's presence so that we may be comforted. And having received such a blessing from God, let us pass it on to our family members, our friends, our neighbours and anyone who we can help in any way that we can.
