Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, 'The harvest is plentiful,



but the labourers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest.'

Then Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every sickness. These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon, also known as Peter, and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax-collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, the one who betrayed him.

These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: 'Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans, but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, proclaim the good news, "The kingdom of heaven has come near." Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons. You received without payment; give without payment.

Exploring the Word

There was some talk a few weeks ago about a national leader looking awkward whilst holding a bible, this led to a wonderful YouTube clip of the comedian James Corden's father, Malcolm, being asked to demonstrate how the bible should be held. Now if you haven't seen the clip nor watched the tv show from which it came that sounds all very "So what?" Malcolm Corden was a Christian bookseller and he clearly not only has a love for books but also for the contents of this particular book. Many of us do. I wonder therefore what would be your "favourite" or memorable passage or passages.

My mother died in mid May and when my sister and I were talking about the readings for her funeral two or three passages were instantly mentioned. One was a psalm another a passage from Romans and the third was a single verse from 2 Timothy chapter 4 verse 7... go on look it up, but not now, afterwards!

One of my many memorable verses occurs in the first reading we heard today. The apostle Paul is exploring what it means to be made right with God and is telling the church in Rome that it isn't what we do that does it

but rather what God has done and it is for us to believe and have faith—justification by faith not works—then in this chapter, chapter 5 verse 8, he encapsulates it for me. The classic three point sermon in one verse:

God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us. It is one of those pithy verses of the bible which says everything but requires us to take it seriously.

It is what has been called the verse of the three crosses.

In this day of instant communication and social media hand-written letters have taken a back-seat but even so when we write to someone we love we sign-off with a cross or three—signifying our love for the recipient of our letter or card. That's the first cross.

When I was a child it was the teacher's prerogative to use a red pen across work that was incorrect. If it was the answer to a question that was incorrect then a cross would be placed to say so. A cross to signify that something was wrong. That's the second cross.

Then of course the third cross is perhaps more obvious—the Cross of Calvary, the place where Jesus was crucified. Yes, God proves to all eternity how much he loves us, that despite the wrong things we do which separate us from each other, still Christ died for us.

Yet whilst our relationship with God is based on faith we are not to sit back and wallow or bask—depending on your perspective. Our Gospel reading reminds us that we need to share that love with others, share that knowledge of God's love with others. How? Well, by proclaiming that the Kingdom of God has come near and by making the world and individuals better. To tread lightly on creation; to tread heavily to eradicate poverty; to not countenance racism since every person matters in the eyes of God. For, as we shall sing in our final hymn we can only "stand amazed in the presence of Jesus the Nazarene."

Affirmation of Faith
