Reading: Genesis 8:19-22

All the animals and all the creatures that move along the ground and all the birds—everything that moves on the earth—came out of the ark, one kind after another.

Sensio Divina

At the heart of our service is a process we call Sensio Divina. To introduce it, here's a quote from Richard Rohr:

All you have to do today is go outside and gaze at one leaf, long and lovingly, until you know, really know, that this leaf is a participation in the eternal being of God. It's enough to create ecstasy.

I invite you to select something living: a pot plant, perhaps, or some cut flowers; a cactus or succulent; or, if you can go outside try to find something like an acorn or a blackberry. All that matters is that it is natural and living.

Now relax and take the time to look intently at the living thing you have chosen: see its colours; notice the richness and the small gradations of shading; feel its roughness and its smoothness. Get to know it. How do you sense God in this part of his creation?

[Take two or three minutes]

Consider your living thing: try to immerse yourself in it. Look deeply and as you do, open yourself to listen to God. What might he might be saying to you through this small part of his creation? In particular, what is God saying to you about your part in caring for the earth?

In the night that Jesus was betrayed, he took bread, work of human hands, gift of our earth, and gave thanks to God. He broke the bread to speak to us of the breaking of his body upon the cross. As we look in our world, in our lives, and in our hearts, for his second coming, keep us close to this vision that we have seen. Through the giving in the bread and wine, reconcile us to our world and give us the broken oneness, the spilt unity, and the buried resurrection by which we can restore your creation and fulfil your will.

Send upon us, and upon all your creation, the life-giving Spirit who first moved upon the waters of the deep. Stir in us the creative and redeem the destructive. Unite us with you through the body and blood of your Son, your Word made flesh as your Word has made flesh.

By whom, and with whom and in whom, in the unity of your Creative Spirit, with all that has been, is, and will be in your universe, we stand before you and worship you, God of all, in songs of everlasting praise,

**Blessing and honour and glory and power
be yours for ever and ever. Amen.**
