

Ministerial Musings

It's Christmas, but not as we know it!

I think we would all agree that for many of us this ranks as one of the weirdest years we have experienced. The concept of lockdown, with no social or wider family contact is deeply unpleasant to most people – after all, there are very few who opt to become a hermit. We tolerated it during the spring and summer when we could spend time outdoors, but Covid hasn't gone away and in any case the summer was by no means easy for everyone – and for those who provide essential services it was a serious challenge.

Now we are looking ahead to what may be a very strange Christmas. So many regular events have already been cancelled, and at the time of writing I have no idea if we can make any sort of family arrangements for festivities. Factor in a lot of cold wet weather and it's all a bit depressing.

However, I wonder if we should be looking beyond our own annoyances. Posting on Twitter some weeks ago, Terry Waite, who spent 1763 days as a hostage in appalling conditions, suggested it is time to stop grumbling. He said, "Change your mindset – you're not *stuck* at home, you're *safe* at home."

Can we change our mindset in relation to Christmas? Can we see beyond the shopping, the parties and the decorations and think about why we have this festival? One thing is certain – it's not really about Santa and reindeer, or expensive presents or even families, but rather about an event that has both amazed and puzzled people for over 2000 years. When Jesus was born in Bethlehem he did not come to start a commercial festival. Rather, he came to bridge the gap between people who are imperfect and God who loves us so much.

Following Jesus is a way of life that many people have rejected, but I can vouch for the fact that faith is the one thing that can sustain us whatever our circumstances might be. It was his Christian faith that



sustained Terry Waite during his appalling captivity, and it can sustain us too as we look towards Christmas and beyond.

Holy Communion is celebrated every Sunday at one or other of the Chet Valley Churches, either Book of Common Prayer or Common Worship, with an informal Holy Communion service once a month in Chedgrave.



I hope that, like many parts of the country, we can put our politics to one side, and do the right thing by delivering this critical help where and when it is most needed.

Thanks for putting your trust in me when you voted last year. The difficult events of 2020 have changed us, and brought us closer together as a community. Let's carry on looking after each other, especially as winter approaches.



We were 'Extremely Impressed' by the military precision at the Chet Valley Surgery when attending our 'flu jabs' in October. The Brigade of Guards couldn't have improved anything. Congratulations to all concerned and brownie points all round!

In these difficult times the media seems to concentrate on the depressive aspect of current affairs, and I sometimes think they could mention some of the more positive aspects of life, such as the above experience!

I worry when I hear that another large area of productive farmland is to be 're-wilded' en-bloc, often, in my opinion, to provide habitat for only a limited number of species, and am reminded of a recent letter in a magazine from a farmer on thin chalky soil in Dorset. Concerned at the paucity of bird life on his farm, he decided to do something about it. He deliberately started to 'manage' his farm for wildlife, returning marginal land to rough grass and wild flowers, which could be grazed, and some woodland; planting some areas as winter bird food, and having flower rich headlands on some of the fields. The result was more

grey partridges (the native ones), and many smaller farmland birds such as yellowhammers and skylarks. Barn owls also increased, and obviously small mammals and their food sources were thriving too. The County Stewardship scheme helped with the cost, and, as he said, the results speak for themselves.

Loddon and District Local History Group

The observance of Christmas Day and possibly more importantly the Twelve Days of Christmas Festival were abolished by an Act of Parliament in 1647 to try to stop the extravagances of the mid-winter festival and to emphasise the importance of Sundays as Holy Days. With varied success the prohibition remained in force until the restoration of the Monarchy in 1660 and the reign of Charles II. Our Churchwardens Accounts show that in the years before the 1647 Act the wine for the Christmas Communion cost about 6/-. The records for the period of the Commonwealth have no entries for Christmas Communion wine. By 1665 we can see that the Christmas Communion is again taking place.

Looking at some 19th century newspaper cuttings recently I noticed that there were several relating to Christmas in Loddon. The twelfth day of Christmas, the Feast of the Epiphany, celebrating the arrival of The Kings seems for some years to have been chosen as the appropriate date for the children of Loddon to have their Christmas Party.

25th January 1873: Norwich Mercury

LODDON

CHILDREN'S PARTY – On Wednesday evening the 15th inst., a children's party was given in the Town Hall Loddon, to which all the children in the town under twelve vears of age and all the children in the Workhouse Schools were invited. At five o'clock (the time fixed for the children to assemble) about 300 presented themselves for admission. The proceedings commenced with an appropriate address by the Rev. Mr. Davison of Loddon: after which the Magic Christmas Pie was opened by Father Christmas (Mr. T. W. Ellis) with an immense knife & fork, each about a yard and a half long. On the pie being cut open, the "four and twenty blackbirds" of nursery tradition flew out and commenced singing, and from the same piece of pastry Mr. E. Pettit gave some very clever impersonations of different animals, &c., and last of all the "King of the Dwarfs" (Master J. Braddock) jumped into the arms of Old Father Christmas. Messrs George Cutlack and D. Hunting then appeared as Punch and Judy, and their curious contortions and evolutions elicited the most unbounded applause from the youngsters, whose roars of laughter resounded through the whole building. But the chief feature of the evening was the Christmas tree, kindly given by Sir T. Beauchamp, Bart., and which was loaded with an immense quantity of very useful articles, contributed by the ladies and gentlemen of the neighbourhood. The presents were then given to the children, each child receiving two articles. Buns and oranges were then distributed amongst them and the children dispersed about nine o'clock, after having spent a most amusing and delightful evening. The Hall was very tastefully decorated with festoons and wreaths of evergreens mixed with roses, and presented a most pleasing aspect. The ladies of Loddon and the neighbourhood came forward and assisted readily in the undertaking, and it is mainly owing to their exertions that the party proved such a success.

Read Any Good Books Lately?

"The Empathy Problem," by Gavin Extence

The world of high finance and enormous profits are what make life worth living for Gabriel Vaughn, a high flyer in the City of London - until he is diagnosed with a brain tumour. He is convinced that nothing in his life will be changed by this apart from the effects of the medication and, obviously, an earlier death that he had anticipated. Something strange happens, though, as the tumour grows. He begins to care about things. Remarkably, he begins to care about other people and their wellbeing; about making changes for them; and very unexpectedly he finds joy in classical music as well as falling in love with a young musician. Unexpectedly there is much humour in the story - often rather dark humour - but humour nonetheless. There is also a great deal of kindness and compassion, just as there was in the first book written by this author ("The Universe Versus Alex Woods").

"Falling in Love," by Donna Leon

Do not be put off by the title of this book - this is not what you might think! It is, in fact, another thriller featuring Commissario Brunetti, set in Venice. Once again, La Fenice, the opera house, is the backdrop of the story, just as it was in the very first of these novels by Donna Leon. Ingredients of the plot are beautiful flowers, beautiful buildings, obsessive jealousy, a few regular characters in the Venetian Police Force (some more efficient than others!), the life of an opera singer and friendship. Always in the background interest is added by being the reader being given snippets of the home life of the Brunetti family, often humorous, often recognisable details and problems concerning the growing up of the two adolescents of the family, with which many readers can empathise! The tension created by the plot, however, is definitely there right until the end of this delightful book.

"Olive Kitteridge" by Elizabeth Strout

The title of this unusual, beautifully written book is simply the name of the person who links together each of the chapters one way or another. These chapters are almost like short stories in themselves, with Olive being sometimes incidental to one of them and at other times, right at the heart of another. The novel is really about a small community - the kind of place where almost everyone knows everyone else. The author is astonishingly clever at creating her characters, often with the minimum of words and by the situations they find themselves in. Olive herself is a retired teacher of mathematics at the local school, so she has known many of her neighbours since they were very young and therefore knows a great deal about family backgrounds. She is a bit gruff, not given to expressing her emotions easily, has no time for fools, but can be kind and loving, especially to her husband and son, but also to others when it's needed. She finds the changes that come with growing old hard to deal with and very frustrating. Altogether she is a most interesting character in a very interesting and enjoyable book.

Nature Notes

I am beginning December Nature Notes mid-way through October as this last week has been interesting in what we have seen. I ended November's Nature Notes listing some of the interesting birds that were around reasonably local that I might try and see. As is often the case they had all moved on the following day, so I stayed home.



However last weekend while in Seething sudden movement caught my attention. Initially my mind thought kestrel, but it looked wrong as it disappeared, it was the wrong shape for a sparrowhawk, which size-wise just left either a late hobby or a merlin. It showed briefly again enabling to rule out Hobby and managing to get my binoculars focused very briefly on its head I knew I was looking at a female merlin.

Normally a bird of moorland they tend to migrate to lowlands and coastal areas in the autumn. One of its prey is meadow pipits which have been building up in numbers over the last week. Also over Seething I have seen and heard my first flock of pink footed geese flying in to spend winter with us

At home I observed a flock of fifty plus silent fieldfares fly over; normally they give themselves away by their harsh calls. Yet more birds signaling that winter is approaching as they move from further north to stay with us. I have since seen them both in Seething and in the hawthorn bushes at Hardley Staithe.

Rachel and I were driving home along our road when suddenly a sparrowhawk flew out of a garden at about 30 centimetres above the road and flew ahead of us along the road. It then swerved right disappearing into our neighbour's garden only to reappear out of our drive and continuing its low altitude flight.

Our "lockdown" garden bird list has also increased by three: Just as it was getting light, I heard curlew calling, managed to trace the sound and saw two curlews flying high over the garden. Later that day a lesser redpoll put in an appearance. Initially I thought it was a juvenile goldfinch, but quickly realised it wasn't. A few days later Rachel saw a grey wagtail walking round the edge of our pond. Unfortunately I missed it by seconds, but I have seen them there some years ago.

Amongst all the wet October weather we have had, there was one sunny morning which was gloriously magical, the sunlight shining on the autumnal leaves was brilliant and it made the colours of everything stand out. The white and black of a male pied wagtail and the yellow of a male yellow hammer just shone out.

Gardening Notes

From the Allotment

Winter is the time to plant bare root fruit trees, bushes, and canes and to prune most fruit **except** plums. It is also a good time to divide rhubarb crowns. A crown will last 5-10 years, but it will save you having to buy new ones if you occasionally divide a healthy one and replant it in fresh ground. A mistake I used to make was to mulch the crowns in winter. Rhubarb is completely hardy and needs a prolonged cold period to do well. Apply manure in spring.

My grape vines suffered badly with the late frosts in 2020 and the new 15cm shoots died right back to the main frame. They grew again from secondary buds but as I feared not strongly, and the crop was greatly reduced. A few bunches for dessert and a single bottle of grape juice!

I tried growing sweet potatoes for the second time this year and they also suffered in the late frosts despite a covering of straw held down by fleece. One plant died all together and the top growth on the rest seemed sparse, so when I dug a couple up at the end of October I wasn't expecting much. I was pleased to get a good-sized tubers, particularly of the variety T65 (quite a pale colour) though the Carolina Ruby also did well. In my first attempt the tubers were delicious but long and thin. Neither variety did well in potato sacks which I tried as an experiment.
