Talk [Rev David]

Another year has begun, another opportunity given to us to reset our goals. Yet we are still struggling with the pandemic which has now been threatening us for a full year. What have we learnt from the past twelve months which might help us thrive in 2021?

Perhaps one thing we have had to re-discover is the art of real communication. Learning to communicate with our family, friends and neighbours has helped so many to cope with the lockdowns endured. Words that in 2019 were only known to a limited number of people have become common and taken their place in dictionaries. Words and phrases such as 'lockdown', 'Zoom' and 'social distancing' for instance. We have also realised that we humans require the touch of others to thrive; and that is something which has been missing for so many. Perhaps we also need to look ahead and, to quote T S Eliot:

For last year's words belong to last year's language And next year's words await another voice.

Whose voice?

The sound of another's voice is reassuring. As a Christmas present this year our grand-daughter received a wonderful piece of technology: in a way it can be seen as an updated, modern version of a tape-recorder. It is a veritable box of tricks which, to quote its blurb, is "...the new audio system for children. Turn it on, pop a figure on and simply let the audio adventure begin. It's all in one box: a Creative-figure ... with room for 90 minutes, so you can upload your MP3s, audiobooks or even narrate your own stories." Plus, you can add other stories which have been pre-recorded. For me it was lovely to have recorded one of my grand-daughter's Welsh books so that she could listen to it. And she knows that it's my voice. Something I'm pleased about since her father's voice and mine have on occasions been mistaken for each other's, much to our mutual amusement.

In our reading from Mark's gospel we read of God's voice being heard at Jesus's baptism. Mark has no real preamble. In Chapter I verse 9 we read: "Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was baptised by John in the Jordan." That's it. Then, in verses 10 and 11, "As he (Jesus) was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the

Beloved; with you I am well pleased." I often wonder how that voice sounded, but however it was, it conveyed the great truth to Jesus about who he was.

It is something that stays with Jesus throughout his earthly ministry, come what may. In the same way the stories we hear have a resonance for us. Something that is apparent in our first reading: the story of creation. Ben Quash writes this about the opening verses of Genesis: "When and why do we tell stories of origins? I was once helped to appreciate the story of creation (he says) by imagining Noah telling it to his family in the dark confines of the ark, when their world had been all but completely destroyed."

I wonder if that is how we feel after this rather traumatic year? A world turned on its head, perhaps not destroyed in the way that the Flood covered the earth, but still so different that we may wonder how the future will emerge.

Jesus's baptism reminds us that the Son of God went into the water because of our sinfulness and came out with the promises that a new creation was about to dawn. To quote Ben Quash again: "No chaos is greater than God's power to make. If God can make a world from nothing, then God can heal the world (our 2021 world) however catastrophically it seems to be falling back into chaos."

Thanks be to God for that.
