#### Psalm 19

- <sup>1</sup> The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands.
- <sup>2</sup> Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they reveal knowledge.

#### **Talk**

#### David Owen has written this reflection.

The year before I needed to choose which A levels to take my school appointed a new Geography teacher to the staff. However his passion wasn't just for geography but also geology. And so in the 6th form a new subject was added to the choices available - Geology A level. So, along with studying Chemistry and Maths, I joined the first group of students at my school to study Geology. Which I loved. Perhaps it was the thought of field trips to the coast of Wales or to Arran that appealed but whatever it was it made an impression so that I continued to

study it for my degree. Whereupon I was able to enjoy field trips to other parts of Scotland as well as the Lake District and a whole summer mapping a small part of Anglesey. The field trips gave us an insight into the rocks that make up the British Isles.

Rocks can be classified into three categories. Igneous, sedimentary and metamorphic. Each having been formed in a different way.

Igneous rocks are those formed from molten lava the product of fire from the belly of the earth - the fiery core which is at the centre of the planet. Scientifically not the same as the story created by Jules Verne in which an adventurous geology professor chances upon a manuscript in which a 16th-century explorer claims to have found a route to the earth's core. Professor Lidenbrock can't resist the opportunity to investigate, and with his nephew Axel, he sets off across Iceland in the company of Hans Bjelke, a native guide. The expedition descends into an extinct volcano... A fantastic story but ...

Sedimentary rocks are created by the slow compaction of eroded pieces of other rocks or shells such that they form a new type of rock.

Metamorphic rocks are those which are made when either igneous or sedimentary rocks are either subjected to extreme heat or put under pressure.

Each type of course has its uses - but they will be different. Trying to use one type out of place might be calamitous. A sedimentary rock like sandstone or mudstone would not provide as solid a base as an igneous rock like granite or basalt if one is building on it.

Yet.... the expression "rock solid" indicates that there is strength and substance to rock which clearly isn't present in shifting sands or squelchy mud! And that picture of firmness, solidity, is the one which is conveyed throughout Scripture about the nature of God and of those on whom one can depend.

David, the psalmist, found his life quite turbulent. A shepherd boy plucked to be king. His encounter with the giant Philistine, Goliath, has him using a stone - a piece of rock - as his weapon of choice. So possibly that was in his mind when he frequently writes about God being a rock. In 2 Samuel 22. I-2 it is written: "David spoke to the LORD the words of this song on the day when the LORD delivered him from the hand of all his enemies, and from the hand of Saul. He said:

'The LORD is my rock, my fortress, and my deliverer.' " God provides the necessary security to him. The concept of God being a rock comes throughout the Psalms. Ps 18.1-3; Ps 62.7-8; Ps 144.1-3 and especially in Ps 19.14: "Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable to you, O Lord, my rock and my redeemer." A verse which is very familiar to me since it was recited, in Welsh, at the beginning of nearly every sermon in the chapel as I was growing up! The prophet Isaiah (Is. 17.10) chastises the people of Israel because they "... have forgotten the God of your salvation, and have not remembered the Rock of your refuge.."

O Lord my rock - What a comfort. What a support. Here is an assurance that no matter what we are encountering in our daily lives there is One who is solid and secure. One who will provide a refuge in times of distress; One who will not crumble away. That's the God in whom we can trust and rely on.

# Time for prayer...

Let's take time to pray for:

- The people we live amongst family, neighbours, friends far or near, acquaintances
- Our national leaders who make decisions that directly affect all of us
- Our church leaders seeking to find a way to enable the church to reconnect face-to-face and yet to preserve the lessons we have learned during lockdown
- Members of church congregations tackling their own decisions about life and faith
- People we know who are still struggling as a result of Covid, either socially or economically or because of long term effects on their health
- Those who are ill, or who have lost touch with society following isolation and are afraid to venture out
- Those who are fearful of the future
- Ourselves, that we might be brave enough to stand out as people of faith and not fall into discouragement

And a prayer about God as our rock:

Dear God,
In a year when so much has been uncertain,
you are the rock on which we build our lives.
Help us to cling to you,
Safe in the knowledge that you will never let us down.
Help us to trust you every day of our lives.

You might want to pray aloud the prayer that Jesus taught his first disciples. Use whatever version or language you wish!

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.
Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours, now and for ever. Amen.
