Bible Reading: Mark 4:35-end

On that day, when evening had come, he said to them, "Let us go across to the other side." And leaving the crowd behind, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. Other boats were with him. A great windstorm arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already being swamped. But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him up and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Peace! Be still!" Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. He said to them, "Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?" And they were filled with great awe and said to one another, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?"

After the Bible reading the reader says

This is the word of the Lord: Thanks be to God.

Talk [Rev Alison]

In our reading we heard about Jesus calming the storm. How did he do that? He was certainly in command of the situation rebuking the wind and saying to the sea, "Peace! Be still!" But they obeyed him?

We know God has power over the elements:

He created the world out of emptiness as the spirit moved over the water dividing the sky from the water and then separating the land and the sea.

He parted the waters of the Red Sea as Moses and the Israelites were fleeing from Pharoah in Egypt bringing them safely to the other side;

He whipped up a storm as Jonah tried to run away from him and what he had been asked to do, and then bringing calm and a whale to the rescue.

Does Jesus have that same power?

In John's Gospel we hear Jesus saying, "I and the Father are one". Jesus and God are one. So, yes, Jesus can do whatever God the Father can do. He

too has control over the elements and can still the storm raging all around the boat on the Sea of Galilee and frightening the disciples.

Lucky for the disciples that they had Jesus and that God is his father! We have to make do with our earthly fathers. When we feel frightened and all at sea, we hope that we can trust them to keep us safe:

Well, my Dad was pretty good at rescuing me from large black spiders scuttling across the floor when I was shrieking in fear as a child; I still don't like them and now I rely on my husband, Richard, to do the same;

At university I had a friend who was quite upset by her exam results; they were not what she had hoped for nor expected and she was anxious about telling her family. When she phoned her university lecturer father, contrary to expectation, he was really kind about it and confessed that he hadn't done very well at university either. She felt much calmer after that.

However good our earthly fathers are, they can never be wholly reliable. Some are frankly horrible. And some are no longer with their families for whatever reason.

In God, though, we have the perfect father – not some distant figure but someone who is close to us. We are told that, through the Holy Spirit, we are adopted into God's family. As children of God, we have the closest possible intimacy with God. St Paul says, "By the Spirit we cry 'Abba, Father'!"

Nowhere in the Old Testament is God addressed as Abba. It was a word distinctive of Jesus. It is an impossible word to translate from Aramaic, the language Jesus spoke; our nearest equivalent is Daddy though this misses the respect for the authority of fatherhood that Abba contains. It is not only a child's word. It was the term that Jesus, the man, used in addressing God.

Jesus allows us to share in that intimate relationship with God when we receive his Spirit. We can call God Abba, Daddy – an intimate name for someone who loves us unreservedly. We can rely on God our heavenly father. Even if we think that he is sleeping and doesn't care, he will be with us through the storms in our lives when we call on him in faith.

So call out and let him hear you. He's always waiting.
