

Reading: 2Timothy 3:14-4:5

But as for you, continue in what you have learned and firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it, and how from childhood you have known the sacred writings that are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work.

In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I solemnly urge you: proclaim the message; be persistent whether the time is favourable or unfavourable; convince, rebuke, and encourage, with the utmost patience in teaching. For the time is coming when people will not put up with sound doctrine, but having itching ears, they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own desires, and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander away to myths. As for you, always be sober, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, carry out your ministry fully.

Talk [Rev David]

There's a wonderful game that one can play which is all about word association. Going round the room, each person says the word which first comes to their mind which relates to the word said by the person before them. If you're in a room with others, play it now. Start with the word: sky. Okay, I wonder where it took you? So then have another go—try starting with the word: bible. What's the first word that comes into your mind?

Bible: interestingly, if you go to a web browser and input Bible, one of the first sites you're directed to—after bypassing the ads which tell how you can buy "bible" at Amazon—is that of Wikipedia but you'll notice that the definite article is placed in front of the word so that it becomes The Bible. There is something about Bible that requires one to be definite about it! Although it is impossible to obtain exact figures there is, in the annals of the Guinness Book of Records, little doubt that it is the world's most sold and widely distributed book. But how do we view this book and how do we handle the writings within it. Jews, Christians and Muslims treasure the books of the Old Testament yet interpret them differently. Over the

centuries the way that the bible has been understood has varied. Christians within its many different traditions will have differing perspectives and won't always agree on what passages mean. Yet there is one important aspect to hold fast to—and that is that people actually read it.

When I was at school studying English Literature there were a few set books which my class studied that I, if I'm honest, only knew from having Coles Notes alongside me. Now that in itself was helpful but wasn't really the same as reading the text. Similarly there are many useful bible study guides which I encourage people to use but to do so alongside, not instead of the text.

Today's readings come from different parts of the Bible. Our first from the collection of poems and songs—the Psalms—reminds us that the bible contains the precepts and stories of God which are there for our wellbeing. A foundation on which to build our lives. The second reading from Paul's letter to the young church leader Timothy emphasises the need for him to return constantly to the sacred writings of his youth. Things he would have been taught from his mother, and as we learn elsewhere, his grand-mother. For Paul and Timothy the sacred writings would be what we now call the Old Testament.

However that does not allow us to turn our backs on the writings which have been incorporated in the New Testament. The essence of the Bible is to tell a story, the story of God's dealings with humanity. That story develops into a relationship, a relationship with Jesus. The One whom St John writes of as The Word. In Jesus we have the written word of God transformed into the Word made flesh. The Bible shares with us Jesus's teachings about Community and Society. About we live to love the Lord our God and our neighbour as ourselves. On this Bible Sunday let us read afresh that story, let us seek that relationship and let us know God's promises through the Word and words of the Bible.

Let the peace of Christ rule in our hearts.


Hymn: Speak O Lord, As We Come to You
