For Zion's sake I will not keep silent, and for Jerusalem's sake I will not rest, until her vindication shines out like the dawn, and her salvation like a burning torch. The nations shall see your vindication, and all the kings your glory; and you shall be called by a new name that the mouth of the Lord will give.

You shall be a crown of beauty in the hand of the Lord, and a royal diadem in the hand of your God. You shall no more be termed Forsaken, and your land shall no more be termed Desolate; but you shall be called My Delight Is in Her, and your land Married; for the Lord delights in you, and your land shall be married.

For as a young man marries a young woman, so shall your builder marry you, and as the bridegroom rejoices over the bride, so shall your God rejoice over you.

For the Word of the Lord, thanks be to God.

Hymn: Fill Thou My Life

Fill thou my life, O Lord my God, in every part with praise, That my whole being may proclaim thy being and thy ways.

Not for the lip of praise alone, nor e'en the praising heart I ask, but for a life made up of praise in every part:

Gospel Reading: John 2:1–11

Alleluia, Alleluia! Christ was revealed in flesh, proclaimed among the nations and believed throughout the world. **Alleluia**!

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John. Glory to you, O Lord.

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' And Jesus said to her, 'Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.'

Now standing there were six stone water-jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, 'Fill the jars with water.' And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, 'Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward.' So they took it.

When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, 'Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now.' Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, O Christ.

Sermon [Rev Ros]

When you're travelling to a strange place it's reassuring to see a sign with the name of your destination on it. You feel a sense of relief that you're on the right road. The sign isn't your destination but it's pointing to it and you can travel confidently knowing that if you follow the sign you'll arrive.

When Jesus turned the water into wine, John called it the first of the signs that Jesus performed. A sign of what?

During the season of Epiphany we explore the different ways in which the glory of Jesus was revealed. Today's reading is about what happened at a village wedding that took place in Cana of Galilee. Jesus' mother was there, interestingly John doesn't name her, Jesus was there too and some of his disciples. They may have been relatives of the bride or groom and no doubt they were having a good time. At that time Jewish weddings went on for about a week. After the ceremony, held in the evening, the guests made their way to the groom's house and there followed the celebrations.

It appears that a few days in the wine ran out. Hospitality was important and it was the groom's family who supplied the food and drink. For there not to be enough was highly embarrassing. Someone didn't calculate carefully enough just how much was needed. It's every wedding caterer's nightmare.

Mary voices her concern to Jesus, "They have no wine", and hidden in that remark is the unasked question, "What are you going to do about it?"

lesus' answer sounds to us as if he doesn't care, as though it's not his problem. "Woman, what concern is that to you and me? My hour has not yet come". To call Mary 'woman' wasn't disrespectful, quite the opposite. What concern is that to you or me means that is outside our responsibility. Perhaps he's giving her the chance to ask him to do something. Certainly, Mary doesn't take Jesus' answer as No for she says to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." What he tells the servants to do is at first sight very strange. Fill up the six water jars to the brim. These jars held water for ceremonial handwashing. The jars were enormous, impossible to carry to the well and bring back full, so they must have had to make several trips using smaller vessels. Jesus apparently doesn't do anything. He simply tells them to draw some off and take it to the steward. He's astonished when he tastes it because it is the best of the best wine! He says to the groom, "Most people serve the good stuff first and save the cheap stuff for later when the guests won't notice". I should think the groom was as puzzled as he was.

This is the first sign that reveals Jesus as Messiah but as his time had not yet come, not everyone notices. The servants knew what had happened and his disciples saw his glory. The real sign wasn't just about turning water into wine but about the generosity of what Jesus was going to do as Messiah. First there was the quantity, gallons of it, so much that the guests would never have time to drink it all. Second was the quality of the wine. It was the very best. This was the sign that Jesus was going to provide life in all its fullness.

Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

In the water made wine the new creation was revealed at the wedding feast. Poverty was turned to riches, sorrow into joy.

Therefore with all the angels of heaven we lift our voices to proclaim the glory of your name and sing our joyful hymn of praise:
