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Reading: Luke 10:25-37

On one occasion an expert in the law stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he asked, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" "What is written in the Law?" he replied. "How do you read it?" He answered, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind;

and, 'Love your neighbour as yourself." "You have answered correctly," Jesus replied. "Do this and you will live."

But he wanted to justify himself, so he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbour?" In reply Jesus said: "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, when he was attacked by robbers. They stripped him of his clothes, beat him and went away, leaving him half dead. A priest happened to be going down the same road, and when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side. So too, a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan, as he traveled, came where the man was; and when he saw him, he took pity on him. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he put the man on his own donkey, brought him to an inn and took care of him. The next day he took out two denarii and gave them to the innkeeper. 'Look after him,' he said, 'and when I return, I will reimburse you for any extra expense you may have.'

"Which of these three do you think was a neighbour to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?" The expert in the law replied, "The one who had mercy on him." Jesus told him, "Go and do likewise."

Reading: Colossians 1:1-14

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and Timothy our brother, to God's holy people in Colossae, the faithful brothers and sisters in Christ: Grace and peace to you from God our Father.

We always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, when we pray for you, because we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love you have for all God's people—the faith and love that spring from the hope stored up for you in heaven and about which you have already heard in the true message of the gospel that has come to you. In the same way, the gospel is bearing fruit and growing throughout the whole world—just as it has been doing among you since the day you heard it and truly understood God's grace. You learned it from Epaphras, our dear fellow servant, who is a faithful minister of Christ on our behalf, and who also told us of your love in the Spirit.

For this reason, since the day we heard about you, we have not stopped praying for you. We continually ask God to fill you with the knowledge of his will through all the wisdom and understanding that the Spirit gives, so that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and please him in every way: bearing fruit in every good work, growing in the knowledge of God, being strengthened with all power according to his glorious might so that you may have great endurance and patience, and giving joyful thanks to the Father, who has qualified you to share in the inheritance of his holy people in the kingdom of light. For he has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of the Son he loves, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

Talk [Nina]

Today's readings are an interesting match. There's the story of the Good Samaritan which is familiar to most of us, where the unexpected person gives help to a man in need. It's a story we can learn from, because it's all about giving without strings attached, and we need to hold on to that thought. But that's not what I want to focus on today—I'd like to think about our reading from Colossians.

Did you notice the bit at the beginning of that reading? Paul says of the people in Colossae "We always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, when we pray for you." Not "if we pray for you", but "when we pray for you". Paul has heard of their faith and love and therefore as a natural consequence he prays for them. For him, prayer is the obvious thing to do.

I remember a conversation I had some years ago with my husband's mother. She said she didn't sleep very well now that she was pushing ninety, but that it meant she could deal with her prayer list which was getting longer and longer and needed a lot of time. When she died we knew we had lost someone who prayed regularly for all the people in her family, in her church and in her circle of friends. Insomniacs have a great ministry!

But to come back to the reading from Colossians, Paul explains why this bunch of believers are in his prayers: It's, "because we have heard of your faith in Christ

Jesus and of the love you have for all God's people". He wants to encourage them and help their faith to grow so that it will bear fruit and he does that by sending them a letter, but more significantly by praying for them.

So far so good, but let's see how that squares up with our own situation. For a start, who do you currently have on your prayer list? Is it family members and special friends? That would be a good place to start, because praying for people we know well enables us to focus our prayers. But are there other people you might pray for? For instance, do you ever pray round the congregation in your church? (That's quite an interesting thought when we come to an online congregation, but the principle's the same.) We can work our way round the folk worshipping with us, but eventually we may hit a problem. What happens when you get to someone you find really annoying? How might you sensibly pray for them?

A wise person once talked to me about praying for people who irritate you. She explained that it might not be easy to do, but that praying for them has the effect of altering your relationship for the better. Which it does! It may not change anyone's personality, but it brings God's love for both of you into the situation and so benefits everyone.

So how should we pray? Looking back at Paul's letter, he says, "We continually ask God to fill you with the knowledge of his will through all the wisdom and understanding that the Spirit gives, so that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and please him in every way". (He says a lot of other things too because he's quite wordy, but that's the essence of the whole thing.) It's a challenge, but at the bottom of it is a simple instruction.

Unpacking Paul's instruction, we can therefore pray: "Please God, fill this person with the knowledge of your will so that he or she may live a life worthy of you and please you in every way." Whether we're worshipping together or individually online, we can pray that prayer for one person or many people.

So who might you support and encourage through prayer?
