You are welcome to join us at any of our services

Holy Communion is celebrated every Sunday at one or other of the Chet Valley Churches: either Book of Common Prayer (BCP) or Common Worship, with an informal Holy Communion service once a month in Chedgrave.



Morning Worship is held regularly in Loddon and Hardley. **Evening Prayer** (BCP) is on the third Sunday of the month in Sisland.

XPRESSIONS (AFÉ is on the first Sunday of the month at All Saints Chedgrave. This is a relaxed and contemporary way of 'doing church'. Open between 10:00am and 12:00 noon you can come and go as you please for coffee, cake, discussion, crafts, games, stories, reflection and much more.

Loddon and District Local History Group

In November, Elvie gave us a talk about some of Loddon's former residents, the work they did and where they did it. Most of this information came from the files in the history group's archive.

Elvie started with details of some of the teachers of the school based in what is now our library. Between 1920 -24 Mr George Herbert Kitchener was the head occupying a house at the end of the school building. He had fought in the Great War and was also a scoutmaster as well as a keen footballer. He was succeeded by William Burton who remained for a long time. Both were helped by Miss Lily Harrod, a supplementary teacher, who retired on March 31st 1941 having served at the school since 1897. Another teacher was Gertrude Victoria Nickalls who worked at the school between 1899 and 1936. She boarded at Mornington House before marrying into the Brown family who ran a motor engineering business. Some of the photos Elvie displayed were copies from photos supplied by Gertrude's family. Amongst other former residents mentioned by Elvie were some of the first Loddon doctors starting with Dr Hunt who lived at Farthing House. Doctors John and Thomas Ebden lived at Loddon House and the Beeches, also used as a lunatic asylum. Their business was taken over by Dr Guyton Jollye and then Dr Pedgrift. In 1952 Dr Bennett arrived and then Dr Armitage in 1956. The latter had taken part in the D day landings. Many people still remember these later 2 doctors and can remember the surgery relocating to Church Plain. The doctors were aided by nurses like Ida Goodbody who rode a tricycle to make her 2,404 visits. Her successor Nurse Mildred Davy was able to use a car . She was a Red Cross Nurse during World War Two and lived in Rodwell Cottage.

Elvie finished by giving us details of some of the Blunderfield family who were farmers for several generations living at either Hales Hall, the White House, Sisland or College Farm.

The information held in the archive is extensive as this talk and previous ones from Elvie have shown. The December meeting will be written up for the next Chet Contact.

The White Queen, by Philippa Gregory

This is the story of a woman who ascends to royalty by virtue of her beauty, rises to the demands of her position and fights tenaciously for the success of her family, whose two sons become the central figures in a mystery that has confounded historians for centuries: the Princes in the Tower whose fate remains unknown to this day. 

Nature Notes

Looking out of our kitchen window on this cold grey day, I'm glad to be inside. However, our dogs did have a quick, reduced distance walk down at Hardley Staithe earlier, more due our elderly dogs' sense of direction than my reluctance to being out in the elements. I managed to spot and watch a couple of Great White Egrets flying around which made it more than enjoyable. In the not too distant past these birds would have created much excitement in the birding fraternity, but they are now becoming more and more common. In fact, over recent months, I have seen more Great White Egrets in our area than the commoner Little Egrets.

There were a few highlights towards the end of 2024, I had a message from a friend telling me he had seen a SEO in fields towards Hardley Street from Hardley Staithe. You may ask what is an SEO, as I did initially, some undercover agent hiding in the reeds! Then my brain kicked in and I realised it stood for Short Eared Owl, a winter visitor to these parts and until two years ago there was at least one overwintering there. They tend to fly in daylight and are beautiful to observe. It was a week before I managed to catch up with it and that was largely due to someone walking across the fields from Hardley Street to the Staithe disturbing it. It was another occasion when my elderly dog was going the wrong way, so I was facing back towards Hardley Street and saw the owl fly up get mobbed by two Carrion Crows and land in the field my side of a line of reeds along a dyke. Once it had landed all that was visible was the very top of its head, sadly to my knowledge it hasn't been seen again.

Another dog walk from the Staithe, along the banks of the Yare to the duck shooting ponds, I was about to turn to walk back when a Bittern flew out of the reeds, disappearing behind a row of conifers. I was surprised to realise to then see it flying back over the conifers, over my head. It continued flying downstream and landed in the reeds on the other side of the river Yare. Invigorated by seeing the Bittern I scanned the duck pits one more time when my eye homed onto a white bodied duck with a dark head swimming along the far edge of the reeds. There where a number of Shelduck on the water but this bird was very different. It then proved the point and dived confirming that what I was watching was a male Goosander. One of the sawbill ducks that we can see during the winter months, but this was the first time I had seen one in this area. I looked for it the following day but failed to locate it again, but the bittern put in another appearance.

In the last nature notes I mentioned I hadn't yet seen either of our winter thrushes but since writing that I have seen both Fieldfares and Redwings but not in their usual numbers. 2025 has seen me start a new bird list, which has crept up to a meagre 53 species by the 5th of January. These I have all seen locally but I do hope to get further afield in the next couple of weeks. Famous last words. What ever the weather, wrap up warm and venture out and see what is about, or as I am doing now, see what is about through a window.

Gardening Notes

Growing Fruit and Veg from scratch: Part 5.f. Mulches

Happy New Year. If your resolution is to grow your own food then there are two allotments free at Hardley Road in Chedgrave. Please contact Hayley Goldson, the Parish Clerk, if you're interested. We'll be pleased to show you round.

The old saying "nature abhors a vacuum" is true. Bare soil is very welcome to plants and they will quickly fill it, which means a lot of weeding, but also the loss of nutrients from leaching or drying out.

Organic mulches like straw, compost or manure will rot down and enrich the soil. But be warned compost and manure will contain weed seeds even if they are sold as not doing so and will only suppress weeds, not eradicate them. Bark, cardboard and newspaper rot more slowly and though adding nutrients and body to the soil they will initially take up some of the goodness to help them breakdown. Old carpet, preferably wool, will not rot so easily or not at all for synthetics. The only time I used a wool carpet as a mulch it was picked clean by the local birds. Cosy nests that year! Weed suppressing plastic mulches, purpose bought or made from compost bags will not rot down though they will degrade over time and must be disposed of.

I often combine mediums so black plastic over manure/compose and plant through them by cutting holes or using newspapers/cardboard with bark on top around fruit trees and soft fruits to save me having to hoe around them.

Sounds in the garden - A Buzzard soaring low across the fence, chased by a loud gang of thug gulls, Swans flying over and the songs of Robins and blackbirds reminiscent of spring.

For 30+ years I have enjoyed growing trees from seeds of found pinecones and seedlings the birds have brought me. Our garden isn't large enough to have them grow into towering giants, so they are housed in pots reaching a height their restricted roots allow, just like the many trees I have witnessed growing naturally in holes and fissures of rocks in Yorkshire and Canada.

Primroses are flowering under the Rosemary, bright yellow Calendulas and a brave Erigeron daisy are in full bloom. Then there are the 10 splendid varieties of Hellebore, some just coming into bud and others in full bloom. Bulbs are poking up here and there and vibrant new shoots are gathering on branches and at the bottom of woody stems of hardy perennials.

I've left the dead foliage and flora of Ferns, Hydrangeas and Chrysanthemums alone, creating sanctuary for overwintering bugs such as Ladybirds. The bird feeders are being kept stocked up and a mouse has been eating a soya wax candle that I made! It's 12th night so we wassailed the Bramley tree, which is looking resplendent with it's two balls of Mistletoe. 'Was hael' is old Norse and means 'be in good health' and 'Drinc hael' 'drink and be healthy' so we shared a libation of a hot spiced apple and ale drink with our tree and put toast soaked in the drink high in the tree's

branches for the robin. Wasshail!
