Ministerial Musings

Just as the seasons of the year change with reassuring regularity, the seasons of the church year change too. From the middle of June (after we have celebrated Pentecost, the sending of the Holy Spirit to be with us in the world), we enter into 'Ordinary Time'.

That name suggests that this period of time is perhaps a bit dull; nothing really happens in ordinary time.

I have recently returned from a walking pilgrimage to Santiago de Compostela, a journey I have made many times in the past. This time was completely different as I was accompanying someone for whom walking was extremely difficult, and we walked at a pace alien to my feet. It was so slow! Yet the value of the slowliness (there is a Swedish word for this which has no good English equivalent) of our pace was immense. I noticed things along the path that I have never noticed before, heard sounds of the countryside more intensely, became more aware of the minutiae in the wonders of God's creation as well as the vastness of it.

The ordinariness of the act of walking was transformed for us into a journey of discovery and delight.

I always look forward to the Christian festivals and will enjoy the celebrations to come at Harvest time and beyond into autumn and winter. But I am in no hurry to get to the next Christian festival; the ordinary is full enough of delight if only we take time to appreciate it.

Indeed, the ordinariness of waking every morning in a country that is safe, with weather that is not too extreme, with neighbours who look out for us and will treat us kindly and with respect; with a government that allows freedom of speech and freedom to worship wherever and in whatever way we wish, and all the other benefits of living in our beautiful land; the ordinariness of seeing family and friends and sharing meals and laughter over small things... surely, the ordinary is far from dull.

When Jesus walked this earth more than two thousand years ago, he too delighted in the ordinary things. His extraordinary teachings were often delivered in parables, or stories, that reflected the things ordinary people, like you and me, could relate to. When I think that this man, the Son of God, who performed miracles, raised people from the dead and ultimately sacrificed himself for the whole of humanity, also took such delight in telling stories, sharing simple meals with his friends and doing other ordinary things, I remember that our lives aren't always better when everything is amazing, exciting and always hurtling on to the next adventure. There is so much joy to be had in the here and now, the ordinary, wonderfully ordinary place and time in which we live. Enjoy a wonderful summer.

You are welcome to join us at any of our services

Holy Communion is celebrated every Sunday at one or other of the Chet Valley Churches: either Book of Common Prayer (BCP) or Common Worship, with an informal Holy Communion service once a month in Chedgrave.

Morning Worship is held regularly in Loddon and Hardley.

Evening Prayer (BCP) is on the third Sunday of the month in Sisland.

News from Your Local Councillors



You will have seen in the news that Norfolk County Council have now published their Options Appraisal and are supporting a single County Unitary for Norfolk.

We believe that this offers the best solution for streamlining back-office functions and providing an efficient one-stop shop for all your council services. We are acutely aware that it's your taxpayers' money that we are spending, and so we must provide value for money. However, that cannot come at the expense of providing quality services which are accessible.

Over the next few weeks, we will be asking for help to shape how you want to see services delivered on a local basis. Would you like your parish councils to have more say on vital issues such as planning, footpaths, car parks etc? Would it be useful if we were to set up a manned office in the local lbrary, where you could go for help with services? For example, if your bin collection was missed, you needed some planning advice, you have a complaint about anti-social behaviour or you need support for an elderly or vulnerable person.

This is our opportunity to reform local government, the last time we reorganised was 50 years ago! We need a modern and efficient new system to suit the needs of our residents. One Norfolk = One Council.



Loddon and District Local History Group

Our old friend Dr Richard (Rik) Hoggett returned to speak at our May meeting on 'Castles in the Landscape'. As always, his talk was fascinating informative and entertaining. He chose three Norfolk castles: Castle Rising, Castle Acre and New Buckenham to illustrate his talk.

All that remains of most castles are humps and bumps covering a few stones; the chosen castles have a lot more to be seen above ground. They were all built in stages after the 1066 Norman Conquest, when William of Normandy defeated Harold, son of Godwin at Hastings. After the death of Edward the Confessor, earlier in 1066, who left no heir, Harold had been voted king by the Saxon Witan. William of Normandy claimed that, some years before, Edward had promised him the crown. All very complicated.

Once crowned, William set about rewarding his Norman supporters by giving them the land and estates of the Saxon aristocracy. 98% of the Saxon lords were replaced. The East Anglian region had major centres at Norwich, Thetford and Bury St Edmunds. Lesser estates at Castle Acre and Wymondham were given to William De Warren while William D'Aubigny (D'Albini) was given estates at Old Buckenham and Castle Rising.

Very quickly wooden buildings were built on mounds, to impress rather than as defensive structures. Stone buildings followed with surrounding baileys and ditches. At both Castle Acre and New Buckenham, a planned town with a market grew outside the castle and Deer Parks were created.

By "The Anarchy" of 1138-1153, there is unrest in the country as the crown was again disputed. During this period the New Buckenham Castle was rebuilt, using stone from the original. The new castle was circular with access to the river, (which could have been dammed as a defensive measure?) a chapel, a deer park and dovecote are all shown on a surviving 16th century map. The New Buckenham castle survived until the Civil War when much of it was taken down. The Castle Rising we see now was built by William the first Earl of Arundel, son of William d'Albini, after 1138, and was primarily used as a Hunting Lodge for the surrounding Deer Park.

Sociopath, by Patric Gagne

Summer is now in full swing giving us all the opportunity to get out and enjoy all the beauty that surrounds us.

On 2nd lune, I drove down to Minsmere and walked to the Island Mere Hide in the hope of seeing a purple heron which had set up residence there. It usually resides in Southern Europe. For such a large bird it is often difficult to locate. It had been seen earlier in the day but by the time we arrived it had retreated into the reeds. Scanning the mere I noticed a brown-looking object on the opposite side half-hidden in the reed bed. I was convinced it moved and as I watched suddenly the purple heron broke out of the reeds and flew across the mere, disappearing into the reeds to our right. As soon as it took off, I called out to everyone present, "Purple heron flying right"; most there were able to see it. While we were there, we were fortunate to see a bittern momentarily before disappearing into the reeds, right in front of the hide. It then managed to creep unseen through the reeds, every so often giving its iconic boom showing us its new secret position. There were several marsh harriers around and I lazily trained my binoculars onto a male which I saw was carrying something in its talons. Suddenly a female appeared on the scene flying at a lower altitude than the male. She proceeded to fly onto her back at which point the male released what he was carrying and the female caught it, righted herself and, I assume, descended to her nest to feed her young, absolutely breath-taking.

A breath-taking moment for Rachel was seeing her first ever swallowtail butterfly in her mother's garden on the other side of the River Yare. They are truly beautiful.

Some of the highlights of May were a water vole in the stream opposite the Loddon vets. I was suddenly aware of movement in the water and thought initially it was a fish until it climbed out onto a branch but unfortunately it was in the shade so there was no chance of a photo, but it was great to see.

Walking the dogs alongside Hardley Staithe, I was aware of movement further along the path. At first, even with my binoculars, I couldn't see what the squirming mass of fur was until it straightened itself out to reveal a stoat struggling with a vole. Also in the dyke by the staithe were a pair of mute swans with their six cygnets, two of which were riding on one of the parents' backs.

To end with, after the dog's last short walk of the day I was aware that our younger dog had something in her mouth which she dropped on command. In the gloom I bent down and picked up the small object gingerly. It started to walk on my hand and its feet/legs felt like Velcro, I quickly realised it was a cockchafer beetle so with some difficulty I put it down safely.

Gardening Notes

Growing Fruit and Veg from Scratch: Part 7b Harvest and Storing Crops

Following on from the last article. Here are the main crops I preserve and how:

Potatoes: these need either a strong paper or even better hessian sacks to exclude the light and keep air circulating. I check these periodically over the winter and throw any rotten ones away and remove sprouts. Onions and Garlic: I string these and hang them either in the garage or my shed. Again, you need to check these over and they will also sprout in spring. I usually pickle the small onions and shallots. Carrots, Parsnips, Leeks, and Brassicas: I leave in the ground and dig up as I need them though as winters grow warmer carrot and white fly, etc stay active longer. I sometimes pickle a red cabbage. Chillis: can be frozen whole without preparation or dried on a strong thread in the garage. Make sure they aren't touching. Beans: I only freeze my broad beans as I find French and runners don't freeze well. **Tomatoes:** I usually make into sauce usually after drying in the oven to reduce the water content and then freeze. **Apples:** I store in old drawers, not touching. Every year I intend to ask for some of the cardboard travs supermarkets use to make this easier. **Soft Fruit:** blackberries, raspberries, blueberries and blackcurrants I pick over and spread on trays to freeze before bagging up. The hanging baskets with tumbling toms and their posse of attractive flowering companions are voluminous. Vegetables in the greenhouse are growing tall and robust. From the garden we've had two courgettes, albeit small ones, and cucumbers are on their way. The big blousy peonies have been and gone but the *Bowl of Beauty* is still in bud; their blooms remind me of the big fake flowers ladies had on swimming caps in the 60's and 70's.

We have been enjoying drink breaks and eating alfresco at every opportunity. 


