Moving On

It's all a bit chaotic in the Owen household just now. For someone like me, who prefers things to be in their proper places, it's a challenge, but it's one that I have to accept.

The reason for the upheaval is that Nina and I are moving on from the Chet Valley, and I will be retiring. It's an odd experience – most people don't have to move house when they retire (although this might be their choice), but once I stop being the Rector of the Chet Valley Churches, we have to move out of the vicarage. It's a time for passing things on to other people and making plans for the future.

Over the past ten years I have made a lot of friends in these villages, whom I hope will want to keep in touch. There have been countless other people whom I've met briefly and whose life stories I have shared. It has been a privilege to do so. There have been events and celebrations within the churches and their communities, but there have also been challenges and sad times. We've experienced huge changes in our national life – the Jubilee, the Coronation, the Covid experience and more. In our churches we've experienced change too, both nationally and locally as new people have come in and others have moved on.

So what am I going to pass on to others? Well, obviously there are a lot of administrative tasks which must now be carried out by volunteers, and I am very grateful to those who offer to help with some of these. But there is much more than that. I would like to pass on a sense of unity and friendship within our group of churches. They are all very different both in buildings and their styles of worship, but together they offer more than most village churches are able to provide.

I also very much want to pass on my enthusiasm for what Jesus offers. After giving his disciples a commission Jesus told them, to "remember I am with you always to the end of the age" (Matthew 28. 20). He was there for those first disciples, and he is there for all of us today, offering reassurance, love and a bridge through which to reach God.

That is the most important thing to pass on, not just to the Chet Valley communities, but to people everywhere. Thank-you for the support and friendship you have given me. I will continue to pray for you.

Worship in the Chet Valley

You are welcome to join us at any of our services

Holy Communion is celebrated every Sunday at one or other of the Chet Valley Churches: either Book of Common Prayer (BCP) or Common Worship, with an informal Holy Communion service once a month in Chedgrave.



Morning Worship is held regularly in Loddon and Hardley.

Evening Prayer (BCP) is on the third Sunday of the month in Sisland.

XPRESSIONS CAFÉ is on the first Sunday of the month at All Saints Chedgrave. This is a relaxed and contemporary way of 'doing church'. Open between 10:00am and 12:00 noon you can come and go as you please for coffee, cake, discussion, crafts, games, stories, reflection and much more.

All Together Worship is on the third Sunday every month at All Saints, Chedgrave, starting at 11:00am. January, March, June and September are followed by a shared lunch. News From Your Local Councillors Norfolk

I was very pleased and grateful to be re-electe County Cou



busy one but there is so much more yet to do. Not least to bring extra money to Norfolk through devolution to spend on economic development, adult learning, redevelopment of brownfield sites and to fund projects like community centres and road improvements. We live in challenging times with the legacy of the cost-of-living crisis and the aftermath of Covid. Every year central government gives us more money to provide services for our residents, but it's never enough to keep pace with the growing demand. We have to find ways to do things smarter and more efficiently in order to keep funding what matters to people. We have to make some pretty difficult decisions if we are to fund, not just our core services like Adult Social Care and Childrens Services, but other important things like museums, libraries, holiday clubs for children, support for sport and art, all the extra things you need, and we want to give you.

Sometimes we find solutions by bringing together organisations to support each other and one example of this is the Loddon Fire Station supporting the Loddon First Responders. This exceptional voluntary organisation supply on call support to assist the Ambulance service. They were looking for a new base and with the help of a local sponsor, I have secured an (almost) new portacabin, which will be installed in the fire station grounds for the First Responders to use when they are on call and for essential training. We rely on our emergency services and initiatives such as this will help save lives. My thanks to all who have made this possible.

The Chedgrave Annual Parish Council meeting was on 2nd May 2024

Election of Chair: Cllr Jo Sinfield was re-elected as Chair and Cllr Bob Demain was re-elected as Vice Chair. Other roles were allocated and full details can be found in the minutes. Jo Sinfield presented her annual report and this will also be available on the parish council website. Thanks to all for their continued efforts.

Wherryman's Way: Planning permission has been granted for bridge work and the council is seeking an update on when the works will begin. The council has also asked that a damaged section of path adjacent to Chedgrave Carr is also repaired.

St Felix Park Development: Phil Varney continues work on this, currently focusing on the Construction Traffic Management Plan. He awaits confirmation of the final plan, trying to ensure the best outcome (or least bad!) for the village.

Litter: There is an increase in littering and anti-social behaviour around the teen shelter at Grebe Drive. A fire was also lit and was reported to Police. The mooring at Chedgrave Common has also seen more littering. Please can EVERYONE use the bins provided!

Bench at Chedgrave Mooring: The council has approved buying and installing a bench at Chedgrave Common mooring to replace the mast which was removed. It should be installed soon so walkers can enjoy a sunny rest in this lovely spot!

Grants Awarded: The parish council has recently awarded grants to Chedgrave Parochial Church Council to contribute towards All Saints churchyard maintenance and Chedgrave Common Charity towards maintenance of Chedgrave Common. Notes from Sisland

I always start writing my entry by looking back, much like a diary, at the previous entries. For 2023 it was the day after the Coronation weekend. The tree, planted by the oldest and youngest resident, is thriving in the geographic centre of the village. Thanks to Peter Burgess for watering and clearing around it for the last twelve months. We followed this with tea and cake at the church. There will be another opportunity for spending time together and welcoming others to join us on Sunday July 14th at Lodge Farm, Sisland when we will be offering Strawberry Teas. The afternoon will run from 2pm until 5pm and all are welcome to join us during the afternoon. The church tower requires some attention to the



window slats and although the work is not substantial, we need to take every opportunity to raise funds to enable the continuous maintenance of this very special building.

For those who are able to visit us this spring and early summer, the grass in the graveyard is left uncut as we want to welcome the wildlife and wildflowers as well as humans to our corner of the parish. It is looking stunning as I write this with bluebells and meadow saxifrage. Churchyards are the single most important refuge for many wildflowers typical of old meadows in Norfolk. The churchyard at Sisland can boast of supporting four of the six 'churchyard dependent' wildflower species — meadow saxifrage, oxeye daisy, lady's bedstraw and burnet saxifrage - these are native species which have at least 50% of their Norfolk population in churchyards. We want to allow them to be able to seed before cutting, which we always try to do before the Sunday teas in August. We are looking forward to the latter and welcoming friends, old and new, for tea and cake. The church is open throughout the year, even if the door is closed, it will be unlocked so please take the opportunity, if you can, to visit us and find a quiet space for reflection.

Loddon and District Local History Group

Our April talk was by Adrian (Zolkowski)-O'Dell about Poles in Norfolk including case studies collected by the Norfolk Polish Heritage Group (NPHG). Adrian's own father was in the Polish Airforce and escaped to England during the Second World War to join a Polish Squadron to continue the fight. 17,000 other Polish airforce men also arrived which meant that 17 Polish Squadrons could be formed and 10 of these were based at 4 of the bases in Norfolk (Swanton Morley, Docking, Hethel and Coltishall) at different times. Coltishall was the only operational airfield in Britain to be controlled by a foreigner and he was Polish. Between 1946 and 1948 the Polish squadrons were disbanded but 11,000 of the men joined the Resettlement Corps as they did not want to return to Poland now that it had become a communist country. Altogether 200,000 Poles were offered British citizenship after the war in recognition of what they had done in the war. 265 former military camps were used to accommodate them, 11 of these were in South Norfolk. Not all parts of the country welcomed them but many integrated, intermarried and used their good work ethic to do well. Membership of the EU later on meant more Poles came here for work and by 2018 there were 831,000 Poles in the U.K. and Polish is the second most widely spoken language in Britain.

In 2016 the N.P.H.G was set up in Norfolk, (Adrian is Chair), to research, record and disseminate information on Poles living in Norfolk which was then lodged in the Norfolk Record Office. So far 30 case studies have been researched and of these 12 are still alive and a third are Polish women. The other two thirds are on men from the military. Adrian gave us some examples of these case studies. Boleslaw Pietocha (1911-84) became the resident psychologist at St Andrews after the war, having been a medical officer in squadrons during the war. He received an MBE for his work. Alexander Pietrzak escaped to England and flew Spitfires from Northalt shooting down VI rockets. He died in 1945. Ewelina Wachnicka, born in 1984, gained an MsC in Food Science in Poland and came to Norwich in 2010 to do a PhD at the Institute of Food Research. She is now a microbiologist and food safety expert in the U.K.

Adrian succeeded in showing us the huge contribution Poles have made to our life in Norfolk and the country as a whole.

Read Any Good Books Lately?

C.J. Sansom

One of my favourite authors over the last twenty years has recently passed away. C.J. Sansom is the author of a series featuring a character called Shardlake, set in Tudor Britain. Shardlake is a lawyer who solves murders and mysteries but also often becomes too close to the machinations of court, putting him in great peril. The first book in the series is called Dissolution and the final novel was the seventh book, Tombland, set in Norwich around the time of Kett's Rebellion. Tombland was launched in Norwich Cathedral and I had the pleasure of attending the reading by C. J. Sansom and hearing him answer questions about the series. He will be sadly missed by all booklovers. Disney+ have just released a series called Shardlake based on C.J. Sansom's books.

The Divided Spy, by Charles Cummings

It's a bit of a spy theme this month! I hadn't read Charles Cummings before but really enjoyed this tale of a disillusioned MI6 agent, Thomas Kell. It encompasses a double plot of a jihadi terroist planning an attack in Brighton and a Russian agent who Kell blames for the death of his girlfriend. With many twists and turns, the story keeps you hooked until the end.

Exposure, by Helen Dunmore

We read this as our book group read and it generated some lively discussions. Set in the heart of cold war paranoia it tells the story of a family torn apart by false accusations and betrayal. With echoes of the Railway Children (father is taken away to prison, family leave to remote location) it's a nuanced and well-rounded story, although the ending did leave our group divided!

I'm going to reread...

The New York Trilogy, by Paul Auster

I last read Paul Auster about twenty years ago but following news of his recent death, I was reminded of how much I enjoyed his books. The Trilogy is three novels that are interconnected and use the props of detective fiction but become something far more. His writing is a unique blend of surrealism, murder mystery and postmodernism, and I'm intrigued to see how much I enjoy his novels a second time around.



Nature Notes

"They're back" I shouted into the house as I was exiting our back door at 7:30 this morning to walk our dogs (May 5th). Overhead I watched two Swifts chasing each other, their screams always indicative of the arrival of Summer. It is amazing to think that these two ariel masters have been flying nonstop since they left their nest last August. The only time they deliberately land is at their nest, all else they do on the wing, and I mean everything. At least the weather today is in agreement with them, being the heralds of Summer. Whereas I saw my first Swallow of the year on the I2th of April and the old saying that "one Swallow doesn't make a Summer" has proved to be very true. It was another couple of weeks before I saw any more.

Overall, a wet, windy and not that warm, April has had a negative effect on birds singing, claiming territories and attracting mates. Especially true of summer migrants that have already arrived. Walking along the Yare and Chet has mostly been accompanied by an eerie silence from the reeds. But in the last few days that has changed as the songs of Reed and Sedge Warblers as well as our resident Reed Buntings have finally been heard as it warms up. To date I have yet to hear a Cuckoo, although Rachel has. However, I have seen two of them flying over fields, their overall shape and size is similar to a small bird of prey, like a Kestrel, but they have a longer tail and a good view of one makes the correct identification easier.

It's been amazing to watch as trees have put on their summer finery, though the Sycamore we can observe from our kitchen window is still in bud and the Birch tree opposite looks a long way from being resplendent in its greenery. It seems that despite the inclement weather, in the plant world Spring seems to have come early.

Our local Robins have mastered feeding from our bird feeders, but I was surprised when I saw a Dunnock doing the same, something I have never noticed before. They usually feed around the base of our feeder picking up any dropped food.

The inclement weather has dampened my enthusiasm to travel further afield. I had thought of going to Westleton Heath to listen to and perhaps see Nightingale, also catching up with Dartford Warblers and Woodlark. Or to scan the flock of Common Scoters to try and pick out the Surf Scoter that is reportedly with them. Common Scoter are sea duck, common to the shores around us whereas the Surf Scoter is a rare American vagrant. Hopefully the change in weather will encourage us all to get out and explore further afield and see some of these species.

PS Walking the dogs at Rockland Broad yesterday evening I was serenaded by a Cuckoo.

Finally, we move out of the house/pots into the garden/allotment. The first thing to do is take time to understand it. Even within short distances the aspect changes and the soil changes which can have a profound influence on what you can grow.

Aspect is a vital consideration and effects temperature, sunshine, drainage, shelter from wind and how frost impacts. Trees/hedges can have positive or negative effects. Grass tends to be longer under trees and hedges and they can bring up vital nutrients with their roots, lock in moisture and improve the soil with their leaf fall. They also protect your plants from wind burn, but I once had a garden next to a leylandii hedge which had incredibly long roots that stole both nutrients and water.

So don't rush, weigh up different factors and how you can mitigate any deficiencies. If you can, find out how the previous occupant gardened and talk to neighbours about what grows best. If the previous occupant let things get on with it or left a while ago, then there should be some good clues. Busy luxuriant weeds and tall nettles indicate a rich soil, this should be good for most vegetables. Dig in the tops of the nettles as a green manure but avoid the roots. Stunted weeds make it easier to clear but be prepared to add lots of organic matter.
