Ministerial Musings

In the elections which took place some parts of the country last month there was, once again, a feeling that people were voting for change. The votes seemed to express a feeling that things shouldn't be the way they are. The rising cost of living is behind a lot of this of course, but it is more than that- it's a general discontent with the way the world is, with our place in it as a country and as individuals.

'It shouldn't be like this!', we say, as we see harrowing scenes in the Middle East and in Ukraine, in Sudan and in the deprived areas of our own country. 'It shouldn't be like this, it should change!' The problem is that most of those events are ones over which we have no control and that we cannot alter. Finding out where we can change things and where we can make a difference flips the mood from pessimistic to optimistic.

In the past six months Loddon has lost two women who made a big difference, not on the world stage but in the Chet Valley. Margaret Shearmur and Audrey Young were involved in every aspect of village life, both with a real heart for the community. We can learn from such inspiring people; our own community is the place where we can change things and make a difference in the lives of those around us.

The pandemic's isolation made us aware of how much we all need others, how much chatting with a neighbour or giving someone a hand affects our own well-being. Jesus' instruction to love our neighbour is not to make us feel virtuous about the good we are doing, it's about building connections, spreading goodwill, breaking down barriers, not retreating into our shells.

It was in another period of world unrest and national uncertainty, the 1930s, that this prayer was developed. You may know it in other forms, but this (so Wikipedia tells me) was the original:

'Oh, God, give us courage to change what must be altered, serenity to accept what can not be helped, and insight to know the one from the other.'

One thing we can all change is our attitude, our openness to each other and our willingness to help others. Those are the things for which we remember people like Margaret and Audrey and they are things that enrich our own lives as well as the lives of others in our community. It might not change events further away but it might just transform a life here.

You are welcome to join us at any of our services

Holy Communion is celebrated every Sunday at one or other of the Chet Valley Churches: either Book of Common Prayer (BCP) or Common Worship, with an informal Holy Communion service once a month in Chedgrave.



Morning Worship is held regularly in Loddon and Hardley.

Evening Prayer (BCP) is on the third Sunday of the month in Sisland.

XPRESSIONS (AFE is on the first Sunday of the month at All Saints Chedgrave. This is a relaxed and contemporary way of 'doing church'. Open between 10:00am and 12:00 noon you can come and go as you please for coffee, cake, discussion, crafts, games, stories, reflection and much more.



which shows a reduction in traffic travelling at the higher speeds, this is good news however we still have a problem which needs to be dealt with, as more than 50% of drivers are still exceeding the speed limit. We will look at what else can be put in place to try to slow down the traffic as it enters the village.

At County Hall we are starting to put together the budget for 2025/26 and once again are facing increasing demands on our limited resources, with no indication from government that we will get the increase in funding that we deserve for our residents. With Local Government Reorganisation around the corner and the opportunity to streamline how councils are run with fewer councils and councillors, we will have no choice but to put the greatest emphasis on value for money and eliminating duplication. This makes the only sensible optionto amalgamate all councils in our county into one organisation. One Norfolk = One Council. I would be interested to hear your views.

In our view it was wrong and undemocratic - that existing Councillors, whatever their political party, were able to vote to stay on beyond the end of their four-year terms, without voters being able to have their say.

Last week I was delighted to be invited to meet the team running Loddon Community Gym, in their premises next to the Library. It was an impressive reminder of the fantastic range of equipment, and expertise, available to all of us. River Chet – sewage discharges reduce in 2024. Those following the campaign to clean up our rivers will be interested to know how the Chet is faring. Nationally there was an increase to 3.61 million hours of sewage spilled in 2024. The Chet bucked last year's national trend, sewage pollution incidents *declined*. Here are the figures. 2024 in **bold** and 2023 in (brackets). The Chet was polluted by sewage **7** (16) times in 2024 lasting **87** hours (132 hrs). **5** (12) discharges were from Sisland Sewage Treatment Works and **2** (4) from Knapps Bridge (Beccles Road, Loddon) into Loddon Beck. No discharges recorded from the pumping station near the boatyards in 2023 or 2024. Overall South Norfolk rivers were polluted by sewage **263** (413) times in 2024 - lasting **3,723** (4,713) hours.

The Environment Agency assessed the Chet as POOR since records began in 2009 (except in 2013 and 2014 when it was BAD.) The main pollutants are sewage and agriculture. The latest Data available is 3/08/23 by the EA. environment.data.gov.uk

If you want better then contact our MP Ben Goldsborough and tell him so, though in fairness all the main political party candidates I contacted about this at the last election expressed a willingness to campaign for stronger regulation and more investment in South Norfolk, particularly as our population increases.

The Environment Agency (EA) has a target of GOOD by 2027 but low confidence in achieving this due to expense and technical difficulties. PBDEs were found in the Chet in 2019. This flame retardant is a so called 'forever chemical' and was voluntarily banned from commercial use in 2009 finally being phased out in 2013.

Notes from Sisland

I always start writing my entry by looking back, much like a diary, at the previous entries. For 2023 it was the day after the Coronation weekend. Our celebration tree, planted by the oldest and youngest resident, thrives in the geographic centre of the village. We have, this year, just held a book sale in the church, with tea, coffee and cake over the weekend. Thank you to all who supported us either through book donations or joining us for a browse. There will be another opportunity for spending time together and welcoming others to join us on Sunday June 29th at Lodge Farm, Sisland when we will be offering Strawberry Teas. The



afternoon will run from 2pm until 5pm and all are welcome to join us during the afternoon. The church tower requires some attention to the window slats and although the work is not substantial, we need to take every opportunity to raise funds to enable the continuous maintenance of this very special building.

For those who are able to visit us this spring and early summer, the grass in the graveyard is left uncut as we want to welcome the wildlife and wildflowers as well as humans to our corner of the parish. It is looking stunning as I write this with bluebells and meadow saxifrage. Churchyards are the single most important refuge for many wildflowers typical of old meadows in Norfolk. The churchyard at Sisland can boast of supporting four of the six 'churchyard dependent' wildflower species — meadow saxifrage, oxeye daisy, lady's bedstraw and burnet saxifrage - these are native species which have at least 50% of their Norfolk population in churchyards. We want to allow them to be able to seed before cutting, which we always try to do before the Sunday teas in August. We are looking forward to the latter and welcoming friends, old and new, for tea and cake. The church is open throughout the year, even if the door is closed, it will be unlocked so please take the opportunity, if you can, to visit us and find a quiet space for reflection.



Loddon and District Local History Group

On April 16th Dr Joy Hawkins came to tell us about Medieval Women: as Healer, Nurses, Midwives and Wise Women. As always Joy was full of fascinating facts with colourful illustrations to support her talk.

We are led to believe life in earlier times was drab, dirty with women very much second-class citizens. Joy showed us that this was not the case. Women were the keepers and guardians of the house with responsibility for cleaning, feeding and keeping the household well. It was known that cleanliness was next to Godliness.

This theory of Humours, developed by Hippocrates, was the dominant medical theory in the Middle Ages and remained so for centuries. It was believed that illness resulted from an imbalance of these humors

- **Blood:** Associated with the heart and a sanguine (cheerful) personality.
- Phlegm: Associated with the brain and a phlegmatic (calm) personality.
- Yellow Bile: Associated with the liver and a choleric (irritable) personality.

Black Bile: Associated with the spleen and a melancholic (somber) personality.

Prayer, Astrology and Trepanning combined with natural treatments were encouraged, bloodletting, purging and herbal remedies. Many modern medicines have roots in early herbal remedies. We only hear of men as doctors, as it was they who wrote books about illnesses and injuries and treatment, but illustrated texts tell a different story. The wonderful brightly coloured illustrations in medieval books show women tending herb gardens, preparing and storing medicines and ointments, tending patients who are ill or injured and delivering babies, all helped by other women. Men are rarely seen except as gardeners, pedlars or patients. Pre-Reformation most non-domestic health care was provided within Monasteries and Convents, as with the Great Hospital in Norwich, centred around the daily services, with simple food and pain relief where necessary. There is evidence that women served apprenticeships as did men. In places women had to be licensed to practice as midwives and were even allowed to perform Caesareans, to save life, usually of the baby, and in cases of difficult births to baptise the baby to save the child's soul.

The illustrations came mostly from the *The Medieval Health Handbook: Tacuinum Sanitatis* which can be found on Google Images



Read Any Good Books Lately?

The Killing Floor, by Lee Child

The first of many in the series. I've been meaning to read a Jack Reacher novel for a while and this didn't disappoint. It was a fun read, maybe not for the faint-hearted - many people are brutally dispatched, and there are a series of twists and turns, which don't always lead the way you think! It starts with Jack Reacher jumping off a bus and walking fourteen miles down a country road into Margrave, Georgia. It turns out that Reacher is the only stranger in town, on the day they have their first homicide in thirty years. And as nasty secrets leak out - the body count mounts.

Bonjour Sophie, by Elizabeth Buchan

A gentle novel which is deceptively engrossing! I very much enjoyed reading this and following Sophie through her lacklustre postwar Sussex life to Paris in a bid to understand her past. It's 1959 and time for Sophie's real life to start. Her existence in the village of Poynsdean, Sussex, with her austere foster-father and his frustrated wife is suffocating.

Escaping to Paris, the wartime home her French mother fled before her birth gives her the chance to uncover the mystery of her family background, and, perhaps, to find a place where she can finally belong.

Girl, Woman, Other, by Bernadine Evaristo

Teeming with life and crackling with energy - this vibrant novel follows the lives and struggles of twelve very different characters. Mostly women, black and British, they tell the stories of their families, friends and lovers, across the country and through the years. It's told in almost a stream of consciousness, with limited punctuation, which works because you read it almost breathlessly.

From Newcastle to Cornwall, from the birth of the 20th century to the teens of the 21st, each character is searching for something - a shared past, a potential future, a place to call home, somewhere to fit in, a lover, a missed mother, a lost father, even just a touch of hope...

On the to be read pile! Is a River Alive?, by Robert Macfarlane

I like Robert Macfarlane's writing and I find the premise of this fascinating. Boldly and persuasively recasting rivers as living beings, this traverses Ecuador, Southern India, Quebec and Macfarlane's Cambridge home in the writer's most personal and political work yet.

Nature Notes

Despite it being much cooler this May bank holiday and there being a strong northerly wind my bird total today for the area around Hardley Staithe increase by three to eighty-four species so far this year. The first on my dog walk, gliding through the windswept sky were three Swifts, quickly followed by a small number of Sand Martins. To complete the trio was a singing Blackcap. This area's been productive during April, highlights being a Grasshopper Warbler singing regularly in brambles by the Staithe. I only managed to catch a glimpse of it, but others have had excellent views. There had been reports of a Ringed Ouzel in the area and I caught up with it in the stubble field beyond the line of Leylandii trees. A female Hen Harrier was a welcome find; it was probably the one overwintering around Strumpshaw Fen. On two occasions I managed to be in the right place at the right time to observe the overwintering Short-Eared Owl, which has kept itself well hidden. As well as regularly seeing Barn Owls hunting over the fields by the Staithe.

In early May there were reports of several Red Footed Falcons at Carlton Marsh Nature Reserve on the outskirts of Lowestoft. They are relatively rare and very attractive birds. The adult male is mostly blue grey with dull red "trousers" and under tail, truly stunning. The female has barred slate grey back and wings with rufus buff underparts, equally a beautiful bird. So off I went in hope of seeing them and there were five flying over Peto Marsh putting on a marvellous flight display catching insects and then eating them while still airborne. With them were also similar sized Hobbies, a much more regular summer visitor. My year list went to one hundred and forty-nine. I was also hoping to see the elusive Purple Heron that has been seen here, this is another vagrant from the continent, but I failed. It is amazing how such a large bird can remain hidden. This was my second failed attempt to see this heron though I have seen them a couple of times in previous years. Despite the long dry period we have been having it is awe inspiring to see so much growth everywhere. It's almost as if trees were suddenly garlanded in their different hues of green finery. Flowers busting forth, insects of all kinds appearing, and of course the bird song. It really gladdens the heart and lift one's spirit. I had noticed some small holes appear in some sheltered dry soil about the diameter of an adult little finger. While watching and wondering whose home they were, an allblack Bumble Bee appeared and proceeded to go into each of the tunnels. Although I managed to get several photos, but as yet I haven't come up with a positive ID. Though it could well be a male of one of the Cuckoo Bees.l don't just enthuse over the rarities I see, (or don't!) Each day I get a real thrill just seeing what is about. Obviously, bird watching is my main hobby and on an ordinary day I can see and hear forty to fifty species of birds. Equally fascinating are what mammals, reptiles, insects, plants etc. there are right on our doorstep. So why not go out on an expedition and see what different flora or fauna you can see.

Gardening Notes

Growing Fruit and Veg from scratch: Part 7a Harvest and Storing Crops

Well, I've covered growing techniques, feeding your crops and the soil so I'll finish this rather long running series of articles with storing crops.

Firstly, you when planning your gardening year, you need to give some consideration as to when you will harvest crops, particularly if you have childcare responsibilities. School holidays were originally designed so that children would be on hand to help with the harvest, though my grandchildren are more interested in eating soft fruit than picking and saving it, but it maybe you are going to be on holiday or occupied doing other things so take this into account. Some crops will stand in the ground quite happily. Others, like courgettes, you may invite your neighbours to enjoy rather than the plant exhausting itself growing marrows. Most people start with the intention of eating crops as they grow but you soon find sudden gluts (and the opposite: sudden failures!). I'm reluctant to compost these excess crops and I try hard to plant successionally or only enough for immediate use and those crops I can successfully store. I'm fortunate to have a large chest freezer and a garage, though it faces south and can get hot even in winter, between 4 - 8C is best. I also need to trap any mice looking for a snack. If you have enough room, you can also keep some crops like carrots and parsnips stored in boxes of Next time: what I try to store and how. Andrew Milner sand or peat.

From Another Garden

We are basking in summer sun today, it's glorious. I've been in the shade under the Bramley tree, creating the 'Helleborium' (a name I invented). My Hellebore collection has been planted, interspersed with various Ferns which are just beginning to unfurl their fiddleheads. I've put in Hostas too and Violets, Pansies, Forget-Me-Nots and lobelia 'Crystal Palace' to create a mist of colour. I've included interesting pieces of wood and flint, nature's sculptures. It's looking fabulous, I'm so pleased with this project which has been forming in my mind for years.

Hellebores flower in early spring and now in late April the flowers are still there albeit faded but with plump seed pods from which I will collect seeds. Seedlings will take around 3 to 4 years to flower and flower type will be a mystery until they do. The 6 varieties of tomatoes are all strong and healthy. Tumbling Toms in their baskets with purple and white Petunias and trailing Lobelia hanging from the porch in view of the kitchen window. Bean plants are raring to go in. I've only had a few curcubits germinate this year, I courgette, 3 cucumbers and a couple of a nameless tasty orange squash, seeds I saved from a fruit last year, still it's enough for us. Sitting beside the Bramley tree in the shade today, watching a myriad of bees buzzing in the soft pink blossoms, petals falling like confetti all around. I can see purple bearded iris, Aubretia and Honesty, the yellow tree Peony, Calendulas and Cowslips, red fuzzy Pulsatilla and peachy double Geums and I can say I feel truly blessed.


