Ministerial Musings

On Facebook in recent weeks (I'm writing this at the beginning of February) I have seen a post repeated several times that says: "How long will January last?" and various similar questions and comments about the length of January. Turns out it had 31 days, just like usual.

I think they were just people hoping for Spring and Summer to come again.

And it got me thinking about the source of our hope.

Psalm 121 begins with that question:

I lift up my eyes to the hills from where will my help come?

It was an ancient belief that the gods lived in the mountains (think Olympus!) and so there would be a natural tendency to look to the hills for hope, just like there is a natural tendency to look to Spring, longer days, sunshine, daffodils and so on. I don't know what to do in East Anglia with the remarkable lack of hills and mountains!

But then the psalmist answers his own question:

My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth.

His help doesn't come from creation; his help comes from the Creator. And that's a good place to look for help if you think about it.

The world is not looking too good at the moment, with all that weather and with the international political scene and

But God hasn't changed, so that's where my hope is. The psalmist concludes:

The Lord will keep you from all evil; he will keep your life. The Lord will keep your going out and your coming in from this time on and for evermore.

And so I think that is the real source of hope - the One who keeps our lives from this time and for evermore. So hang on in there. Jesus will be back!

Holy Communion is celebrated every Sunday at one or other of the Chet Valley Churches: either Book of Common Prayer (BCP) or Common Worship, with an informal Holy Communion service once a month in Chedgrave.

Morning Worship is held regularly in Loddon and Hardley.

Evening Prayer (BCP) is on the third Sunday of the month in Sisland.

XPRESSIONS (AFÉ is on the first Sunday of the month at All Saints Chedgrave. This is a relaxed and contemporary way of 'doing church'. Open between 10:00am and 12:00 noon you can come and go as you please for coffee, cake, discussion, crafts, games, stories, reflection and much more.

News From Your Local Councillors



Devolution may actually be finally happening for Norfolk. We have been accepted onto the devolution priority program by the government, only six areas have been offered this fast track. You may remember we thought we had achieved Devo last year and then we were cancelled at the last minute! We are still not over the line yet, but if all goes well this time, we will be having elections next year for a new mayor for Norfolk and Suffolk.

This is important because, similar to other areas who have a regional mayor, we will get money for economic development, Housing, Transport, adult skills and many other things, to be delivered a strategic level. Norfolk has been underfunded and overlooked for too long. There will be a consultation on the changes running until the end of March, please have your say.

Next, we will be looking at local government reform, where we tear up the twotier system and abolish eight councils to replace them with new unitaries. These new councils will provide a one stop shop for services. More on this later.

In terms of wider local politics, as mentioned last month a lot of work will be taking place over the next two years as our District and County Councils prepare for the creation of unitary authorities. I said that I would pass on, via this column, what I hear and find out about decisions made which will affect all of us. It has just been announced that we are one of the areas where next year's scheduled County Council elections will not now take place, something that I and my South Norfolk Labour colleagues do not agree with. The wider announcement puts Norfolk and Suffolk on the path to becoming a Mayor-led strategic authority by May 2026 if we proceed.

I'm also continuing my work chairing the South Norfolk Scrutiny Committee, on behalf of all of us, which I'll continue to update you all about.

Best wishes to our new MP Ben Goldsborough as he deals with the treatment for cancer that he has revealed he is undergoing. Whatever people's politics, I think we would all agree that Ben works incredibly hard for all of us in this role.

Finally, my next surgery, at Loddon Library, is 26 April 2-3pm.

Loddon and District Local History Group

The December talk, organised by David Crease, saw a packed room. David's talk covered 'a brief history of beer and brewing - from Tudor to the early nineteenth century'. Firstly David explained about the different stages of brewing and the difference between ale and beer. Both were being drunk in medieval England. Herbs like nettles and wormwood were used in brewing and then various plants were used as finings to clarify the beer. Some of these were poisonous like foxgloves but really not that much is known about early brewing as no records were kept. Throughout the talk different samples were handed out for tasting experiences and these were received with enthusiasm and interest.

David then moved on to talk about breweries which were often in ordinary homes while bigger households had dedicated breweries. Monasteries and priories brewed a lot of beer before the Reformation as did the colleges at Oxford and Cambridge. Glass was not used because of the tax on glass but once the tax was removed clarity and colour became more significant. The talk was much enjoyed.

In January, Mary Fewster returned to talk about 'The development of artificial landscapes from private gardens to pleasure gardens and municipal parks'. Mary argued that Norwich had a lot of open spaces in the early seventeenth century and wealthy people started to create private gardens like Lord Henry Howard who had acquired land from the Augustinian priory which he laid out as a garden down to the river. There was even a Banqueting House which people could admire from boats on the river. Other pleasure gardens were then created and opened to the public like Moore's Spring Gardens in 1739, the Wilderness designed by Samuel Bruister as a naturalistic landscape in 1750 and Widow Smith 's rural garden opened in 1763 near St Stephen's Gate. These gardens started to compete with each other to attract visitors by putting on firework displays and concerts with opera singers and orchestras. In 1785 balloon flights were offered and even circus acts were performed.

These first pleasure gardens were replaced in the nineteenth century by others slightly out of the centre like the Plantation Gardens and serving tea instead of alcohol. Municipal gardens like Chapelfield Gardens were developed at the end of the nineteenth century and later on the Mile Cross Estate had municipal gardens placed in the overall plans. A very interesting talk.

The Women, by Kristin Hannah

A novel of epic love and loss. In 1965 the world is changing, and Frankie suddenly imagines a different path for her life. When her brother ships out to serve in Vietnam, she impulsively joins the Army Nurses Corps and follows his path. As green and inexperienced as the young men sent to Vietnam to fight, Frankie is overwhelmed by the chaos and destruction of war, as well as the unexpected trauma of coming home to a changed America. This is a real page-turner!

The Odd Women, by George Gissing

I stumbled upon this, started reading it and was totally drawn in! It's a novel of social realism and satirises the situation of unmarried women in the late nine-teenth century. During a time when many novelists were celebrating the 'new woman' it turns this idea on its head. Set in grimy, fog-ridden London, these 'odd' women range from the idealistic, financially self-sufficient Mary Barfoot and Rhoda Nunn, who run a school to train young women in office skills for work, to the Madden sisters struggling in low-paid jobs and experiencing little comfort or pleasure in their lives.

Circe, by Madeline Miller

I loved Song of Achilles by this writer and Circe is just as good. Banished by Zeus to the remote island of Aiaia, Circe cultivates her skills. She encounters legends: the messenger god, Hermes, the craftsman, Daedalus, a ship bearing a golden fleece, and wily Odysseus, on his epic voyage home. As her power increases and her knowledge grows, so Circe must make the ultimate choice: to decide whether she belongs with the deities she is born from, or the mortals she has come to love. Beautifully written, it draws you in and is a delight to read.

I'm looking forward to......Onyx Storm, by Rebecca Yarros

I'm a latecomer to the genre of romantasy but I'm keen to see why there is such a stir and excitement around these books. Onyx Storm is the third in the series so I might start at the beginning. Dragons and romance – who could ask for more?



Nature Notes

Monday, 3rd February, I asked my friend whether he would prefer RSPB Minsmere or NWT Hickling. "Hickling" he replied. Arriving, we went to check if anything interesting was about. The highlight, a Slavonian Grebe apparently showing well at lookout point I. I noticed on their "what's about screen", a Brambling, a winter visiting finch, seen from the visitors' centre. On asking where we were pointed to a feeder hanging just outside the window just as a beautiful male Brambling flew in giving us wonderful views of this orange and black bird. We made our way to viewpoint I, carefully checking with the map we had been given. On reaching it, we were confronted with an expanse of empty water. Fortunately, before long, the Grebe came out from behind some reeds giving good views. We walked on and scanned an area of shallow water and mud and by chance I picked up a small, long tailed orange bird which I instinctively knew was a Bearding Reedling. After lunch we checked out Brendon's Marsh an from the viewing platform we could see a flock of small birds flying round. Through my scope I could see they were Linnets, amongst them I picked out a pipit, which I identified as a Water Pipit, a winter visitor from the Alps. Hickling was the right choice.

Back in January I took the dogs to Ness Point in Lowestoft in the hope of seeing five species of birds. I have seen all five of them there in winter but never on the same day. Parking in Links car park, where I hope to see Mediterranean Gull, I drew a blank. So slightly disappointed, the dogs and I set off towards Ness Point, only to discover we were walking directly into the sun, making seeing anything difficult. Halfway, I noticed three small waders on the concrete rocks, two Purple Sandpipers and a Turnstone. That was two of my five ticked off. Just before we reached Ness Point, I noticed a dumpy looking wader on the rocks, I knew it was a Knot but in the wrong location. Usually, it is found on the mudflats in large numbers. Just past Ness Point I saw a Black Redstart, I had stunning views for a few moments and was very pleased to mentally tick off bird number three. Walking back to the car, a pair of small birds flew from the rocks, Rock Pipits, bird number four, these only occur round our coast in winter in small numbers. The Mediterranean Gull was waiting for me in the car park, all five birds seen plus the bonus of a Knot. I can assure you this sort of thing rarely happens.

My bird year total stands at 106, 59 I have seen in the Hardley Staithe area.

As Spring is fast approaching see what you can see around you, as it can lighten you heart.

Growing Fruit and Veg from scratch: Part 5.g. Dig or No Dig?

Last time I discussed various mulches which brings me neatly to dig or no dig. In favour is that soil structure takes time to build up and digging disturbs it, but 'no dig' uses mulches to suppresses weed and feeds soil from the top down.

It's not as simple as that or we would all do it. First, you need to get the ground as free of perennial weeds* as possible usually by covering them with light excluding materials; like cardboard plastic, wood chip or straw, but this can take a long time 2-4 months for dandelions/stinging nettles but months longer for couch grass. Better to use organic materials as these simultaneously feed the soil. There is also the cost of mulch and ongoing cost of replacing it. I offset this against my time and the wear and tear on my back. Finally, you can't completely avoid some weeding.

I'd like to do more but don't have a reliable bulk supply of mulch. You may say potatoes are traditionally trenched (disturbing the soil) but I have grown potatoes successfully by simply laying them on clear soil, covering with 15cm of straw and topping this up once the tops show. It saves considerable effort, and other crops are not so hungry of mulch. I guess what I'm saying is choose what suits you, your resources and health, but don't discount new ideas.

I nipped to Loddon DIY to get compost and bird food, then to my garden for inspiration in the bitterly cold easterly wind which had blown the Brown bin over. Bird feeders are topped up and there's fresh water in the bird bath and dishes on the ground for animals, warm water out when it's been icy. A tray of bird seed outside the kitchen window lets us see robins, blackbirds and pigeons (greedy things) up close, this morning there was a dear little mouse in it. If it's empty the robin and female blackbird come and look in at me expectantly until I top it up. Secateurs in hand I pruned Clematis and Rose bushes, still in big pots awaiting their raised bed and trellis, I aim to complete the project this year, fulfilling Mum's express wish to have her ashes fertilise some Roses.

I decided to sew some seeds despite the wicked wind as the moon is waxing, that is going from new moon to full moon. Apparently sowing seeds for plants that crop above ground are best done when the moon is increasing, and root crops do best when planted when the moon is decreasing or waning, going from full moon to new moon. So in the nice clean terracotta pots I've sown 5 types of tomatoes and some cucumbers. They are now in the house lined up on window sills in the warm. I was going to sow some Coleus seeds but when I opened the packet it was empty! Now the waiting begins, it's always a lovely surprise when the very first seedlings appear.
