



I was delighted the other day when I was out on a walk and saw my first Brimstone butterfly. Bright sulphurous yellow, it was unmissable as it flitted in and out of the blackthorn bushes which were just coming into flower.

On another walk a week or so later, I stopped to run my finger along the soft catkin of a Pussy Willow tree. Definitely strokable, you can tell how the plant gets its name.

It struck me how I could have missed both of these things if I hadn't first of all been outside, and secondly if I had been in such a rush that I didn't have chance to notice them. Two beautiful things right on our doorstep—part of the wonder of the natural world all around us.

How often do we stop to enjoy what is right in front of us, I wondered. How much do we pass by and take for granted. Might we not even notice if one day these lovely things have just disappeared having never noticed them before? That would be such a shame! And yet...

Our precious, fragile world needs loving care and attention for it to flourish, just as we need loving care and attention. And yet, how often do the perceived needs, greed, of humans take precedence over the needs of the natural world?

I believe that God created the world that we have, that it was good and freely given to us to care for. So we have a responsibility to use, not exploit, the earth's resources and to look after them.

How can we look after something that we don't even know about? How will our children and grandchildren look after something that they don't know about if we haven't shown them and helped them to understand?

We have two bank holidays coming up this month. Why not spend some time outdoors getting to know your neighbourhood and what lives there; the plants and the animals. Spend time looking at the beauty of flowers, no two daisies the same! Look at the bumble bees around you—not so many as in previous years, human beings have seen to that—did you know that there were so many different types? Whether or not you believe in a creator God, you can't fail to feel restored and re-invigorated by taking just 10 minutes to use all your senses to appreciate the beauty of the outdoors.

#### You are welcome to join us at any of our services

**Holy Communion** is celebrated every Sunday at one or other of the Chet Valley Churches: either Book of Common Prayer (BCP) or Common Worship, with an informal Holy Communion service once a month in Chedgrave.



Morning Worship is held regularly in Loddon and Hardley.

Evening Prayer (BCP) is on the third Sunday of the month in Sisland.

#### **News from Your Local Councillors**

Many of you may have seen the rumble strips in Langley Road, Chedgrave. These are

an experiment to see if they help with speed reduction when going from a 60 to a 30 mph zone. The results will be known when the data is analysed from the speed camera.

However, rather than constantly installing expensive measures reminding drivers to slow down, which local taxpayers have to fund, it would be better if they weren't needed, and drivers showed restraint when entering a residential area and some respect for the speed limits.

There really is no need to speed in our towns and villages. Aside from Langley Road, we see it in Norwich Road, Bridge Street, High Street, Beccles Road, George Lane and many other places, mainly from a handful of drivers who think the law doesn't apply to them. Our roads are narrow, our pavements too, we should feel safe walking on them but due to the intransigence of some motorists, people are put at risk. Please slow down, speed limits exist for good reason, your journey will take a few moments longer by obeying them, and all will thank you for your consideration.

### **Loddon and District Local History Group**

Georgette Heyer was unable to give us her lecture in March for medical reasons so Elvie Herd stepped in at short notice to give us an interesting talk on 'The Loddon Doctors'. We wish Georgette all the best.

Elvie's earliest record of a doctor living in Loddon is for Dr Samuel Swaine who died in 1727. She also came across Dr Charles Palmer who married the daughter of John Randell who lived in Chedgrave Rectory. Dr Peter Conold died in 1752 and he was probably related to Samuel Conold, the vicar of Loddon and Chedgrave.

Elvie then moved on to the Loddon houses associated with the doctors. Dr Nelson operated from Farthing Green House which he left to his daughter who had married Dr Hunt, a doctor, surgeon and male midwife. Dr Hunt had practices in Norwich, Gissing and Loddon.

Loddon House was the 'lunatic asylum' run by Doctors John and Thomas Ebden. John had served as a military doctor during the American War of Independence. Elvie has found some adverts that John placed looking for 'lunatic' patients and an apprentice to train under them providing the apprentice paid 'a premium'. Between 1763 and 1822 Guyton Jollye lived at Loddon House and he also advertised for patients. After his wife died he married a young widow only to find that her missing husband had turned up in Yarmouth. There was also a murder of an employee on the premises. Later on Dr Robert Pedgrift rented the premises from Guyton's son but he lost his licence in 1845 when an inspection found poor standards of hygiene in the practice. Eventually Dr Prior took over and added a small consulting room (later became the Post Office).

Rodwell House was the home and practice of Dr George Rodwell and later on his 3 sons, Doctors Henry, Edward and John. There is a memorial window in Loddon church dedicated to the Rodwell family. The Chestnuts was rented or owned by several different doctors but was later bought in 1952 by Dr Pat Bennett who retired in 1978. He was horrified by the state of the surgery at the side of the house so brought in improvements. As the village was growing in size he took on Dr Armitage (retired 1988) and then Dr Bevington (left 1991). Eventually the surgery moved to Church Plain and then to George Lane, becoming the Chet Valley Medical Practice.



### **Read Any Good Books Lately?**

#### Careless People, by Sarah Wynne Williams

An essential read for anyone interested in the reach of social media and Facebook in particular. Careless People exposes both the personal and political fallout when boundless power and a rotten culture take hold. Wynn-Williams rubbed shoulders with Mark Zuckerberg, Sheryl Sandberg and world leaders, and in this book reveals what really goes on among the global elite – and the consequences this has for all of us.Sarah Wynn-Williams saw Facebook's potential and knew it could change the world for the better. But, when she got there and rose to its top ranks, things turned out a little different. A gripping but horrifying read!

#### Mansfield Park, by Jane Austen

This year marks 250 years since Jane Austen's birth and I'm rereading her novels. I thoroughly enjoyed the improvised comedy show, Austentatious, at the Theatre Royal recently. Mansfield Park is not the best known of Austen's novels but it's one of my favourites. Taken from the poverty of her parents' home in Portsmouth, Fanny Price is brought up with her rich cousins at Mansfield Park, acutely aware of her humble rank and with her cousin Edmund as her sole ally. During her uncle's absence in Antigua, the Crawford's arrive in the neighbourhood bringing with them the glamour of London life and a reckless taste for flirtation.

#### Trust, by Hernan Diaz

Everyone in 1920s New York has heard of Benjamin and Helen Rask. He is a legendary Wall Street tycoon; she is the daughter of eccentric aristocrats. Together, they have risen to the very top of a world of seemingly endless wealth-all as a decade of excess and speculation draws to an end. But at what cost have they acquired their immense fortune? A literary puzzle about money, power, and intimacy, Trust is a novel that challenges the myths shrouding wealth, and the fictions that often pass for history.

The 'to be read' pile **Sunrise on the Reaping - The Hunger Games,** by Suzanne Collins—I read the other books a long time ago now but I remember how fast-paced and brilliant they were. This is the eagerly awaited fifth Hunger Games book - and second prequel - which places fan-favourite Haymitch Abernathy centre stage in an unputdownable tale of danger, action and intrigue set during the fiftieth deadly contest. As the day dawns on the fiftieth annual Hunger Games, fear grips the districts of Panem. This year, in honour of the Quarter Quell, twice as many tributes will be taken from their homes.

#### **Nature Notes**

I must start by sincerely apologising for the absence of April's Nature Notes you will have to put it down to me having a "senior moment" as it completely slipped my memory.

So here we are in May, spring is in full swing, and the majority of our summer migrant birds will be with us. In the next few days Swifts should be arriving and their screaming calls heralding the coming Summer. Despite the cold winds, March and so far, April have given us many sunny days and our solar panels are in overdrive. Having become accustomed to the familiar call of Chiff Chaffs. I wondered which would be the next summer visitor I would see. I must admit I would never have guessed what it would be. On the 4th of April walking back up Hardley Staithe from the Yare I caught sight out of the corner of my eye a medium sized grey bird, which I initially took to be a wood pigeon, flew up from the reeds and conveniently landed on top of a fence post. To my surprise I was looking at a Cuckoo, unfortunately it didn't stay long enough for me to get a photo. Anyway, that took my year total to I22, and birds seen around Hardley Stathe this year to 68. This morning while walking the dogs from Hardley Staithe as far as the shooting duck lake my total went to 69 when I found an Avocet on the edge of the water there.

The rest of the day I had planned to take a friend birdwatching at both Ranworth Broad and then on to Hickling. We arrived at the first port of call expectant to see an Osprey. Yes, we were told that the male was around collecting sticks for his nest. Sadly, after waiting for an hour and a half, the Osprey didn't appear. Though we were entertained by several pairs of Great Crested Grebes doing their courtship displays. We also saw a Common Tern diving for fish. The hope is that this year the Ospreys will nest and raise young there, so a return trip is on the cards. Returning to the carpark I heard my first Blackcap of the year and while eating our lunch we had Swallows putting on a show overhead. Hickling Broad proved more successful as I was hoping to see Garganey, a small summer visiting duck whose drake has a wonderful white crescent over each eye. At the reception we were told where the best place was to see them. Unlike the Osprey the Garganey were far more obliging and we quickly spotted three males. Also, we saw a couple of Little Ringed Plovers (LRP,s). Moving further around Brendons Marsh at Hickling we found three more LRP's, four Ruff, a Dunlin, three Black Tailed Godwits and a snipe, heard Common Crane bugling and numerous other wildfowl. In all my year list increased by six to 128. Despite not seeing the Osprey we had a most enjoyable day.

So, keep your senses alert and see what you can find in our wonderful world, it can really do you a power of good.

### **Gardening Notes**

#### Growing Fruit and Veg from scratch: Part 6b Crop Rotation

In the last article I covered the basic rotation system on an allotment and how to feed the soil in preparation for each new crop. This time I'll discuss variations.

A basic 4 rotation plan would be POTATOES  $\rightarrow$  ROOTS  $\rightarrow$  BRASSICAS  $\rightarrow$  PEAS & BEANS  $\rightarrow$  POTATOES.  $\rightarrow$  = Follows

If you only have room for 3 beds you can amalgamate the brassicas and roots.

If you have a large plot you may want to grow other ground hungry crops like squashes or grow more of one thing than another to meet family needs. I have seven equally sized beds each 6 x 3m and use two beds to supply enough potatoes to last the winter (they ran out in January this year) and a whole bed for onions and shallots (I still have a few shallots left but the onions also ran out in January).

Maybe your family love beetroot or salads, in which case you will devote a bigger area to these. No point growing what the family don't eat. Salad crops like radish can often be grown between the rows of slower growing crops, but lettuces need more space to develop so you will probably want to dedicate some specific space.

If you have the bad luck to get club root in your plot you can leave brassicas out of the rotation as long as necessary.

A final reminder: the key to any rotation plan is keeping a record.

#### From Another Garden

Sunshine arrived with the Spring Equinox, calling me into the garden at every opportunity. There I am privileged to be joined by my fearless little mate the Robin who lands within inches of me and we chat, he loves Vine Weevil grubs.

The ground beneath the Bramley tree has been cleared. The immovable metal pole has been cut off with an angle grinder. Around the back of the shed were bags full of homemade compost and turf which was removed before the greenhouse went in. They are now lovely friable rich earth which I have used to raise the soil levels and nourish the plot, as a lot of it had been under paving slabs for decades.

I've laid an area of old bricks and Norfolk pamments, on which the newly sanded and oiled garden seat sits. It looks good against the shed which I have painted black and is in a shaded north facing position, a cool place to sit out of the summer sun.

I am pleased to see that most of my overwintering plants which looked like they had expired are actually alive, especially the Cannas, Lemon Verbena and Pomegranate bush which I wonder if will ever bear fruit.

All tomato plants have been potted on. Seeds sown this month, German Camomile, Helichrysum, Bush Basil, Liquorice, Chillies, Courgettes and 3 types of stringless Beans. Some of which have already germinated, things are starting to get very busy in the greenhouse now.


