Ministerial Musings

Did you know that October 17th is International Day for the Eradication of Poverty? That got me thinking, what do we actually mean by poverty? One dictionary defines poverty as "being extremely poor".

Do you remember the Make Poverty History campaign during the early years of this century? I wondered what effect it had and what happened to it? The campaign actually halved the number of people living in absolute poverty across the world. But we are in danger of more people living in absolute poverty now because of withdrawal of aid, ruined harvests because of changing weather patterns, war and other factors. Is there a difference between being poor and being poverty stricken? Being poverty stricken or living in absolute poverty surely means having nothing; no means of providing shelter or buying food. It means being destitute with no hope of even subsisting.

Jesus was brought up in a working-class family and his parents brought a poor person's sacrifice of two pigeons when he was presented in the Temple as a baby. His earthly father worked as a carpenter for a living, and so did Jesus before he began preaching. He didn't own a house and borrowed a boat and a donkey. He was even buried in a borrowed tomb.

When Mary anointed Jesus' feet with very expensive perfume, the disciples objected and said it was a waste. The perfume could have been sold and the money given to the poor. In answer to this criticism Jesus said that we would always have the poor with us. What did he mean by that and what was he expecting us to do about it? Mary's act was an extravagant gesture of love for Jesus, which he accepted. "You will always have the poor with you" is part of a quotation from Deuteronomy 15: 7-11. which says that if someone from your community becomes poor, you shall not harden your heart or shut your hand against that poor person, but you shall open your hand to them and lend them sufficient for their needs, whatever they might be...For the poor you will always have with you and it is God who commands you to open wide your hand, to any poor person in your community. And Jesus expects his followers to help anyone because he taught us that anyone in need is our neighbour, wherever they live,

So Jesus words are to spur generosity to the poor, by giving in an open-handed way to those in need, with no thought of getting anything back.

Loddon and District Local History Group

The August talk was given by Sandra-Jane Stock who has been a nurse for most of her working life. She gave us a description of children's nursing from 1982 to the present, outlining the changes she witnessed through these decades. Sandra is the oldest of 5 children and when she was 9 her mother was diagnosed with M.S. so her school years were not always easy. While she was a pupil at Norte Dame in Norwich she was allowed to visit the Great Hospital for one afternoon a week where she worked on the wards and learnt about hygiene. This experience influenced her wish to become a doctor but she realised that her sciences were not good enough for her to get into medical school. Instead she turned to nursing.

In October 1982 Sandra started her first year of student nursing at St Mary's in Paddington. An introductory 6 weeks was followed by 8 week placements with two weeks of training in between the placements. The uniform was much stricter then and not always comfortable. Sandra described some of the types of equipment she first experienced - mercury thermometers, mercury sphygmomanometers, stainless steel bedpans and oxygen tanks as there was no piped oxygen then. Patients were allowed to smoke on the wards and alcohol was sometimes given out

When Sandra qualified as a Registered General Nurse she was awarded a 'Mary's Penny' which she showed us. In 1986 she started working with children at Great Ormond Street and she outlined some of the practices employed. Bubble wrap was used to keep children warm and they used a headbox for babies in need of oxygen. Toddlers with croup were nursed in oxygen tents.

By 1989 Sandra was a paediatric sister in the Hillingdon hospitals. In 2002 she gained her degree and between 2007 and 2021 she worked as a Paediatric, Respiratory and Allergy Clinical Nurse. Altogether she has worked with children for 40 years.

Sandra has witnessed huge technological and social changes in hospital care and the audience asked her to expand on this. She mentioned how computers and machinery had developed as diagnostic tools but she thought that sometimes staff forgot to look at the patient. In the 1960s parents were not allowed to stay with their children in hospital but today they are. Training of nurses has changed and new roles have been introduced like nurse practitioners and clinical nurse specialists but pay for nurses is still not that good.

An interesting talk which was enjoyed by everyone present, particularly those with nursing experience.



Read Any Good Books Lately?

One, by Eve Smith Guest reviewed by Katie Cox, from the Angel book club

Set about two generations in the future, where humankind have nearly irreparably damaged the planet. Due to the need to limit the population there is a strict one child policy, policed by the Ministry of Population and Family Planning. The story follows one of the employees, Kai, who discovers a long-kept family secret, which if discovered by the authoritarian state, will mean severe penalties for her and her parents.

This book is an uncomfortable read, with me questioning whether our actions could possibly lead to a future like that portrayed. Not my usual choice of a book - but I found the story gripping and exciting.

That Night, by Gillian McAllister

I found this a very tense and chilling read, but couldn't put it down! It asks the question about how far you'd go to protect your loved ones, and then examines how lies and betrayal can spiral. Frannie accidentally kills a man with her car late one night and she turns to her siblings to help cover up the crime. Their family holiday in Italy turns into tragedy, the fall-out lasts for years. The sibling relationships in this are neatly done and it's a real page-turner!

Butter, by Asako Yuzuki Translated by Polly Barton

The cover of this book was one of the main attractions for me initially! But having seen it everywhere last year I decided to pick it up and wasn't disappointed. It's inspired by a true story about a female chef, who is also a serial killer. Manako Kajii will not speak to anyone when she's arrested but she can't resist replying to Rika Machida who writes asking for her beef stew recipe. However, Rika is also a journalist... I love reading about food and this book was a pleasure!



Nature Notes

Autumn is well and truly upon us; summer migrant birds have mostly left, replaced by birds from further north. Leaves of our deciduous trees change from green to hues of reds, oranges, yellows and browns, amazing in the autumn sun.

Looking out of the window typing this, today's weather is anything but summery. Earlier we were amused by a Woodpigeon unsuccessfully trying to break off twigs from a plant for nest construction, you don't even need to go out to enjoy the natural world. Last month I mentioned that my list of birds seen or heard around Hardley Staithe had reached 92, the question being will I reach 100 by the end of the year. Well, with the addition of a Willow Warbler seen earlier in the bushes near the Staithe car park, as of the 4th September the number moved to 98.

August was an interesting month with two surprises, one one not a bird. Number 93 was a juvenile yellow wagtail. I thought I had seen one the day before but wasn't sure. It conveniently landed on the shed as I got out of the car, excellent views. Yellow wagtails used to be regular summer visitors but in recent years are rarely seen. Three days later I saw a Hobby as I set off with the dogs, elated at finally catch up with this migrant bird of prey. Little did I know what was yet in store. Returning up the Staithe I noticed what I thought was a large gull, but on looking closer my heart raced and jaw dropped. Fumbling for my phone I put out the message that a White Stork was circling over my head. In my excitement I forgot to check if it had rings on its legs so I would know if it had escaped from somewhere or part of the Sussex reintroduction scheme. Mid-August I saw House Martins there, I know they nested in Hardley Street and was surprised I hadn't seen them before at the Staithe. On the puddles on the lower track I caught up with a Green Sandpiper, a migrating wader. I saw it again this morning. The non bird I saw was a Seal in the river, I thought at first it was just some flotsam floating up the river but then it dived and I knew what I was looking at.

Knowing what waders have been seen both at Buckenham marshes and opposite at Cantley Sugar Beet ponds we do miss some flooded areas on our side of the river. In past years there have been some parts of fields between the Staithe and the Mill semi flooded and it attracted a variety of waders. Though it would do little regarding crop yields for our farmers. Will September get me to 100, I will just have to wait and see and continue enjoying the amazing beauty of the nature all around us.

From the garden

Hello I am standing in for Hazel who is enjoying a few days away and will be back here next month. My garden beds have increased in size over the last 18 months mainly with dahlias as I find more varieties that I can't live without. The range of colours and forms is increasing all the time. I have grown a new local variety, Normandie Farewell, a pink miniature decorative flower and it produces lots of blooms. The blooms should last until the frosts and then I will dig them up, dry the tubers remembering to attach a label with the variety noted, store cool and dry until next march when I will pot them up and hopefully take cuttings to increase the number of plants. August and September have been busy as there are several dahlia shows locally to visit and/or exhibit.

Another change for next year is that I have decided to get rid of the grass, my soil is free draining and the summers are getting dryer so I decided to create a drought tolerant garden along the lines of Beth Chatto's dry garden and over the autumn I will clear and replant with drought tolerant plants. I don't expect it to be low maintenance and it will need watering in the first year to help it get established. Now is the time to plant bulbs and winter bedding, my colour choices for this year are blue and orange. Enjoy your garden.


