Chedgrave Parish Council held its Meeting on 1st December 2022.

Happy New Year! Due to the timing of meetings and publication of Chet Contact, this update may be a little out of date.

New Councillor: A new member, David Richards, joined the council at the December meeting and the council is delighted to welcome him on board. There is still one vacancy left so please contact the Clerk if you are interested.

Langley Road Development: South Norfolk Council Development Management Committee met on 14th December 2022. Cllr Colin Gould, Vice Chair of Chedgrave Parish Council spoke on behalf of the parish council to object to this plan as did one Chedgrave resident. DCllr Jeremy Rowe also attended in support of the community. Despite this, the Committee approved outline planning permission for the development on Langley Road comprising 76 dwellings. The key reasons given were that South Norfolk Council cannot currently demonstrate a five year land supply due to "Nutrient Neutrality" impacts on other potential sites (see https://www.southnorfolkandbroadland.gov.uk/planning-applications/apply/2) and the fact that the site is included in the (currently draft) version of the Greater Norwich Local Plan. The development was recommended for approval by planning officers and there had been no objections from statutory consultees such as NCC Highways and Natural England as well as organisations dealing with water, drainage and flooding. Full details of the proposal are yet to be confirmed and the parish council will consider these matters in due course as they arise.

Chedgrave Courier: All residents should have received the Winter 2022 edition of Chedgrave Courier. If you have not received a copy, please contact the Clerk or pick one up from The White Horse pub.

Wherryman's Way: Work has quietly been going on to ensure the re-opening of Wherryman's Way. Dredging work has been carried out and there are plans to repair/replace the bridges. Many thanks to the Wherryman's Way Working Group, led by Cllr David Johnson and including representatives from Chedgrave, Loddon and Langley with Hardley. The group is hopeful that the path will re-open in 2023.







Loddon and District Local History Group

In November we had a really interesting talk by David Hamblin on 'The Chemists and Druggists of Loddon' concentrating on the period 1882 to 1992. David had been one of these chemists when the shop was owned by Rees T Coghlan and had found a book on the premises outlining some of the prescriptions previous Loddon pharmacists had issued. This had sparked his interest in finding out more about the lives and works of his predecessors.

David outlined some of the Pharmacy and Public Health legislation that had been passed in the 19th and 20th centuries to improve health and hygiene and regulate practice. In 1841 the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain was founded, gaining a Royal Charter from Queen Victoria in 1843. In 1868 a Pharmacy Act restricted the sales of poisons like strychnine so that only registered pharmacists could sell them. In 1933 a Pharmacy and Poisons Act meant pharmacists had to be trained and pass exams while the Medicines Act in 1968 limited the number of pharmacists who were allowed to prescribe drugs. Although anatomy was well understood by the medical profession, the transmission of diseases was not. Two Public Health Acts (1848 and 1875) started to improve the hygiene in towns by supplying services like clean water but there were still some outbreaks of cholera and typhoid.

David provided some details of the five owners of Loddon Pharmacy before Boots took over. John Bailey (1764-1854) acquired the premises of 4 The High Street and Baley's Yard where he started his practice, probably before 1841 when he was listed in the census. He was also a landowner and worked in insurance too. Thomas Ellis (1835-1900) succeeded him and lived there with a family of nine children, four of whom had died by the 1891 census. He was also the postmaster and liked to entertain with puns and terrible rhymes. He is buried in Loddon churchyard. Frederick Larder (1873-1934) took over in 1911. He kept an account of the prescriptions issued, some of which David read out to our horror and amusement; patients did well to survive some of their treatments. His son Frederick Arthur Larder (1904-1971) ran the pharmacy alongside his first aid work.

Rees T Coghlan (1926-2022) succeeded him. He qualified as a pharmacist in Nottingham in the 1940s and had a strong Christian faith. He developed his own system of buying medicines in bulk to sell on in smaller quantities which meant it was cheaper for customers. Rees also made his own medicines which would not be allowed today. He went on to buy three more pharmacies in Norfolk and even opened a care complex in Aylsham for which he was given an MBE. He retired in 1991.

Poems to Fall in Love With by Chris Riddell

It Ends With Us by Colleen Hoover

Lily's life has been one of trauma, growing up in a house with domestic abuse, she befriended a homeless boy, Atlas, and they tried to rescue each other. Moving on years later and Lily is in a very different place when she runs into Atlas again but history is about to repeat itself—in all kinds of ways. This was followed up with It Starts With Us last year but I'm not keen to revisit the characters just yet....

Many Different Kinds of Love by Michael Rosen

I dipped into this out of interest and then virtually read it in one sitting! It's a very absorbing account of the poet's struggle with covid. It incorporates poems about his recovery and memories of being in hospital with nurses' medical diaries. It's deeply moving and a beautiful tribute to the NHS.

Sea of Tranquility, by Emily St John Mandel

Showered with acclaim last year, Mandel's latest (slim) novel is connected but not a sequel to two of her previous books—Station Eleven (now a successful TV series) and The Glass Hotel. This time we travel backwards and forwards in time, to the near and distant future, with Mandel imagining a new life for humanity lived on moon colonies built to escape the ravages of climate change on Earth. A beautifully written slice of science fiction.

I won't be reading...

Spare by Prince Harry--I'm pretty certain I won't need to; it's been talked about obsessively in the media anyway!

I will be looking out for...

Old Babes in the Wood by Margaret Atwood, a compelling-sounding collection of short stories—not out until early March mind you!

Nature Notes

By the time you read this it will be February, but I will still wish you a very Happy New Year. Did I meet my target of 200 birds seen during 2022? The simple answer is no, despite the fact that by last June I was only around 20 short. I just seemed to have lost steam, even though there were some rare birds around, I was unable for various reasons to go to see them. This year, who knows, I will probably just enjoy seeing what is in my local area with occasional trips further afield.

This year, I have already seen 76 species just round this area. Having struggled to catch up with barn owls last year, it was encouraging to see two separate birds on our way to Seething on New Year's Day. Next day, there was one quartering the marshes near our home. We used to see them there regularly. Just before New Year's Day looking out of our kitchen window a flock of small birds landed in our neighbour's silver birch. Assuming them to be the usual goldfinches, I lazily picked up my binoculars and looked for their red and gold colouring but I became momentarily confused as I couldn't find what I expected. Then my brain kicked in gear and I realised they were lesser redpoll. One new bird for 2022! Would they hang around until 2023? Well, yes, there was one today with some goldfinches.

Taking the dogs for a short walk, first thing in the morning just before Christmas, there staring at me from a low branch of a silver birch was a tawny owl. Fumbling to get my phone out and the camera switched on, while not letting go of the dogs, was too much for it and it disappeared. Then this morning, same short walk, same tree, different branch, less fumbling and I managed to get a few shots of the bird; although only in silhouette it is obviously a tawny owl.

During December I was seeing kingfishers regularly around both Hardley Staithe and Langley Dyke, I also had really good views of one flying across Chedgrave Common. Enjoying the adrenaline rush of watching this bird I was then surprised by a muntjac deer staring at me from a patch of bracken on the track off the common. There was its beautifully-striped face framed in the bracken.

Volunteering at the Earsham Wetland Centre last week, clearing up branches I saw, what I now know was a Harvest Mouse. Lovely orangey-brown colour, small, elongated body, long tail and small ears. It has been many years since I last saw one.

Not knowing what this year will hold for us can be a worry, but remember there is always something to see in the natural world that can lift our spirit and bring a smile to our face.

Gardening Notes

From the Allotment

Hopefully one of your New Year's resolutions is to grow more of your own fruit and veg. Allotments often become available at this time of year so for the Loddon allotments by the Mill then contact Emily clerk@loddonpc.org.uk 01508 522 020 and for the Chedgrave Hardley Road allotments contact Hayley 01508 528310 chedgrave.pc@gmail.com. If none are available at the moment, then they can add you to the waiting list.

My avid reader (Hi!) recently asked me how the various trials I undertook in 2022 were getting on. Well starting with the mushrooms, these were a disaster. I followed the instructions as closely as possible though quite how you exclude worms when you are using horse manure and straw to build the beds I don't know. Manure comes with its own compliment of worms if it has stood for any time at all. On the other hand, the gherkins were brilliant and from just three plants I had so many jars I don't really need to grow more this year. Anyone like a partly used packet? For the coming year I was experimenting with winter onions, winter lettuce and winter spinach (as advised by Monty Don!). All survived the cold snap.

I have mentioned before how important allotments can be for pollinating insects, but a camera trap recently installed at Loddon allotments found some larger beasties, including the increasingly threatened water voles, along with common water shrew, short-tailed field vole, field mice, hedgehogs and wrens. Happy New Year.

From the Garden

February is the time to start sowing seeds. I have been looking at the plant and seed catalogues that have arrived over the Christmas period (postal strikes allowing) and always have to scale back the order as I get carried away with all the new varieties and colours.

This year I am going to sow Echinacea, Scabiosa and Campanula. Some of the plants I have ordered are a blue hibiscus, asclepias tuberosa and amaryllis. The amaryllis are usually grown indoors as they are often available as Christmas gifts so I will try them outside, plant from March onwards, they flower I0 weeks later, leave in the ground with a mulched to protect them from frost. Asclepias tuberosa also known as butterfly weed has orange flowers and flowers until autumn, also they are not a favourite food of the deer! I will keep you posted. We have a few new trees and hedging to plant purchased from the Queen's Jubilee trees for Norfolk, part of the Queen's green canopy. I am keen to add a few evergreens to the garden, either a dwarf cedar or a mountain pine, also berberis for the berries in winter.

There are several gardens open locally this month for snowdrops: Lexham Hall, Horstead House, Hindringham Hall, Raveningham Hall, Bagthorpe, Chestnut Farm and Gable House Redisham. Gable House is open on the 12th February and is well worth a visit as they have many unusual bulbs, plant sales and refreshments. Enjoy planning your garden.
