Ministerial Musings

Corpus Christi

Dear friends.

I am writing this just after the feast day of Corpus Christi and it seems to me that this year is particularly poignant for celebrating the Eucharist as the body of Christ, in its double meaning of bread and wine and also as the church.

Often when we exchange the peace we might use the bidding "We are the body of Christ. By the one Spirit we were all baptised into one body" (based on I Corinthians 12:13). Over these months of pandemic and lockdown, many of us have grappled with deep questions about what it is to be church when we couldn't meet together and couldn't share communion. Even now the "new normal" is not the same as before. Still we can't hug or shake hands or sing (although we long and pray for a day not too far off when we hope those things will be possible again).

Perhaps our Eucharistic practice has changed too. In Methodism we tend to use "real" bread rather than wafers and in normal times I liked the thought of using something close at hand and ordinary in the way lesus took what was near and made it holy and special. But infection control and Covid security make breaking and distributing real bread very difficult without touching hands and needing to sanitise between every person receiving. So since we have been allowed to be in church again, it has become my practice to make tiny communion "parcels" at home with a wafer dotted with wine from a pipette in a little tinfoil packet while wearing mask and gloves. In some of our chapels these are distributed URC style with stewards distributing to people in their seats. This minimises human movement around the building and means that each wafer is untouched by any hand except for the one who receives it and unwraps it. Receiving "in both kinds" with wafers and wine together is common practice in healthcare settings but I never thought I would have to give such close attention to infection control in a church setting. Some bigger churches use commercially prepared tiny communion cups with individually packaged wafer on top but I quite enjoy doing the preparation myself and it minimises plastic waste (although my method is more chapel sized than cathedral sized!)

So we are the Body of Christ in a changing world. In all the sorrow and pain of the pandemic, perhaps it has given us a few tiny gifts too. We have learned that the church as the Body of Christ is not limited to our church buildings but the Spirit of God moves across oceans and continents, times and ages, virtually and in person in a way which can liberate us. May we be brave enough to accept the challenge of Corpus Christi:

"WE are the Body of Christ. In the one spirit we were all baptised into one body."







Notes from your Councillor Kay Mason Billig



Loddon, George Lane and A146 junction roundabout:

As many of you will know, this is a project I have worked to deliver in my role as a District Councillor, for over 2 years. I am pleased to say that having brought the District, County, Local Developer and other interested parties together, the work has finally started. I'm told it should take approximately 22 weeks, provided we have no problems, like bad weather. I ask that local residents bear with the inevitable delays and increase in traffic during this time. It will be worth it.

Covid Update:

I am pleased to report that the latest figures for Coronavirus infections in South Norfolk are now down to 4 per 100,000 people, that's a reduction of 33% from the previous week. This data was accurate as at 30/05/2021.

Empty Homes:

South Norfolk is adopting a new policy aimed at bringing empty homes back into use. This includes those that appear to have been abandoned or are seriously neglected. Money has now been set aside which can be used either in conjunction with the owner, as a loan to tidy up the property or as a last result, for compulsory purchase. If you know of a property which may fall into this category, please let me know.

As your new County Councillor, issues already brought to my attention include:

- The poor road surface in many areas

What's going on in the churchyard at All Saints, Chedgrave?

In 2018 the church council decided to make the churchyard a haven for wildlife and to maintain it in an environmentally friendly way. Each year, we will leave much of it unmown until the autumn but make paths through the long grass to allow access to graves. We have planted wild flowers and bulbs. We have created insect hotels, log piles for hedgehogs, bird boxes and a bee bank. We have become part of the Chet Valley B-line joining up areas of pollinators for bees from the start of the River Chet all the way to Chedgrave Common. We have responded to the call from Wild East to set aside 20% of the churchyard as wild land. We are using the churchyard for worship and education, as a place for rest and community action. This Spring we were delighted to find some meadow saxifrage. This is a species in national decline for which churchyards are important habitats. Our species list this year already has 46 species of flowering plant on it.

Our work in the churchyard supports other 'green' initiatives including: our use of FairTrade goods; our charitable giving; and using a green electricity producer. We still have a long way to go but we hope our small steps are leading towards a better, kinder environment for all living things including us and those who follow.

We are aware that not everyone likes the look of the churchyard though many are very happy with it. Any requests to strim particular graves should be made to the clergy or churchwarden whose contact details are in the church porch. Indiscriminate strimming of areas in the churchyard is not permitted and has already destroyed some of our rare meadow saxifrage.

Loddon and District Local History Group

The weather has improved and I hope that means the plan to update some of the local graveyard surveys has made a successful start. It had a positive response in my History Group Newsletter with enough people volunteering to be able to continue.

The first two are Hardley & Heckingham. The results should be available at the Holy Trinity Open Day in July. If you would like to join in for a pleasant afternoon in July or August, let me know at elvie.herd@uwclub.net No previous experience necessary.

While preparing for Hardley I was reminded of the Goddard and Hayward families who for many years lived in Hardley and the nearby parishes. In 1871 we find young Edward Walter Hayward born in Loddon farming 300 acres in Hardley. The next farm entry on the census sheet is for the family of Edward and Sarah Goddard living at Hardley Hall. Edward Goddard was farming 400 acres. Their daughter Clementia is a few miles away at Hellington acting as Housekeeper for her brother Samuel who was living there while farming 210 acres.

Edward Walter Hayward and Clementia Eliza Goddard married in 1875, and they moved into Hardley Hall. They had at least six children: two sons and four daughters. One son Edward died very young, but the other children grew to adulthood. Educating the girls seems to have been a priority as in 1891 the two elder girls, Marion and Ellen, are in Richmond at a school where Lucy Hayward from Bungay was a mistress. Marion had to take over running the house when her mother died in 1892 while Ada married Arthur Sadd from Loddon in 1907. Sadly Ellen died in 1914. Jessica the youngest daughter, born in 1883 did not marry, instead she trained as a nurse at the Norfolk & Norwich Hospital. In 1911 she was working in the Ipswich Workhouse & Infirmary. During WW1 she was as a nurse in Military Hospitals, later she returned to Suffolk and worked as a District Nurse for many years.

Jessica wrote a diary describing her wartime journey on the Transylvania and subsequent rescue. Elizabeth Walne in 2014 wrote an account of her research into Jessica's life after reading this diary. This account can be found in the Archive for 2014 at https://elizabethwalne.co.uk/, or a copy of the diary and Elizabeth's blog is in our Archive.

We read in the EDP of July 1884 that Edward has taken over Mr Thomas Elliot's Model Dairy in Great Yarmouth, and is to supply milk and cream from his own dairy Farms in Hardley. Later he advertises that he supplies the Prince of Wales. Edward continued working at Hardley Hall until his death aged 91 in 1930. A memorial plate in Hardley Church tells us that he was Church Warden there for 48 years. He was survived by his son, Edward Nelson, farming at Priory Farm in Great Cressingham, and daughters, Marion, Ada and Jessie. A fascinating family!

Read Any Good Books Lately?

"Take a deep breath and read. It'll calm you."

"The Wonder," by Emma Donoghue

If you've read "Room," by Emma Donoghue you will expect this book to be superbly written - and you won't be disappointed. The "Wonder" of the title is a child of ten, reputed not to have eaten anything at all for a month and yet still alive. The setting is nineteenth century Ireland, a Roman Catholic community. For two weeks a nurse from England is sent for, to watch over the child who has become famous, and has been tasked with proving or disproving that the child is indeed not eating or drinking (except for sips of water). Love and compassion abound even though it is quite a chilling story. Such a happening was totally believable to many people at a time when religion was tantamount to superstition, especially in a small Irish village. It is a real treat to read such a well-written and engrossing novel.

"Watching the Dark," by Peter Robinson

Written nine years ago, this is an Inspector Banks detective novel. Some of it takes place in England, much of it takes place in Estonia. It's a good thriller involving Banks in solving two deaths. One victim is a retired policeman and the other, several years earlier, was a young girl of nineteen. The plotline includes police corruption, the abuse of illegal immigrants, and wealth used to protect those who kill or profit from the business of trafficking Eastern Europeans. It's a good read.

"How it all Began," by Penelope Lively

A really good, rather unusual, novel. When out shopping one day, Charlotte, a woman in her sixties, a retired teacher of English Literacy and Literature, finds herself slammed face down on the pavement and her bag taken. Unable to get up or walk; kind bystanders help her, an ambulance is called and she is taken to hospital where she is operated on and cared for over several weeks. When sufficiently recovered to walk on crutches she cannot look after herself at home, of course, and has to go and live temporarily with her daughter, Rose, and son-in-law, Gerry. Since her retirement Charlotte has helped to teach people with reading difficulties, some who come from other countries. Boredom sets in for Charlotte and she decides to help an individual from the class, Anton, who she was teaching before her mugging. Rose and Gerry are happy for him to come and have lessons with Rose in their home - and this is where the story really takes off.

In the course of reading this delightful novel readers will meet a range of interesting characters. all of them adding considerably to the entertaining plotline the author has created. The one person we don't meet, however, is the troubled 14 year old boy who mugged Charlotte at the very beginning of the book and thus caused the whole story to begin...

Nature Notes

Saturday 29thMay, a bank holiday weekend, and surprise, surprise the sun is shining and there is only a gentle breeze. We were in Seething and are greeted first by the distant call of a Cuckoo. Rachel had already heard one earlier at home, stood at our back door. I was enjoying the fact I was warm without wearing multiple layers and the cacophony of bird song just seemed so much better. I was being serenaded by Blackbird, Chaffinch and Yellowhammer; the scratchy song of the Common Whitethroat, interspersed with the sharp song of the Lesser Whitethroat plus the backing vocals of a Chiff Chaff. Swallows swooped over the fields calling, then effortlessly gliding into view came a glorious Red Kite.

Later the same morning I was at Earsham Wetland Centre, the first time volunteering this year. Still enjoying the warm sun while clearing branches etc., from around the scrapes and enjoying the company of a Little Egret and Kingfisher amongst others not to mention some rare breed lambs and two of the Suffolk Punch horses. It could not have been more idyllic.

On the 19th May a possible Great Reed Warbler came up as being seen at Breydon Water in the morning. Having never seen one, I thought I would wait and see if confirmation would appear before driving to Great Yarmouth. The siting was confirmed so needing to get some shopping at Asda (other supermarkets are also available) I set off Great Yarmouth. Shopping bought, I walked along the seawall to where several people with telescopes were standing. Arriving I was greeted with, "Oh it's just stopped singing" and "It's been in that small clump of bushes between the rail track and the A47". Checking my watch, I realised I only had 30 minutes before I needed to leave for home. Fortunately, the bird was very obliging and appeared within my allotted timeframe, though it didn't sing (if you can call its song singing).

Earlier in May, while driving along Cock Road, I saw a male Marsh Harrier being mobbed by a Crow. Stopping safely to watch, they both landed in the field only to be "attacked" by a Hare, both birds quickly retreated into the sky. It was later watching BBC Springwatch I realised that the Harrier was after Leverets, (young Hares). Springwatch also answered the question of what happened to our nesting Blue Tits. The cold weather had meant that oak tree leaves were late which had the knock-on effect of there being no caterpillars for the Blue Tits to feed their young. I haven't yet been brave enough to look into the nest boxes.

On the IIth May I decided to take the dogs to Westleton Heath see if I could hear any Nightingales. Although books tell you that they sing at dusk and just before dawn, the education system has unfortunately failed these birds and they will often sing during the day. After a good walk with little seen except single Wheatear and an Adder that crossed our path. On returning to the carpark, I could hear Garden Warblers singing and was able to get some good views of a couple of these sulking warblers. Then from the middle of a gorse bush, by the car park, came the beautiful full song of a Nightingale, mission accomplished!



Gardening Notes

From the Allotment

Hopefully, you are all enjoying your fruit and veg harvest, busily picking and eating, freezing and preserving though goodness only knows what the weather will be like by the time you read this. A very strange stop go stop season! Keep feeding those crops still growing. You can use liquid seaweed, widely on sale, but my neighbour, a marine biologist, cautions that it is not all sustainably harvested. So you may prefer to make your own comfrey or nettle feed. This is simple; all you need is a bucket stuffed with either and then filled with water. Leave it two weeks until it rots down. You'll know when it is ready from the smell. Dilute and use.

Also continue to plant those vegetables that can be harvested in winter or will stand over it like leeks, kale or winter cabbage. There is still time to grow more beetroot, but I find as soon as it turns hot and no matter how much I water the spinach bolts.

You can still plant autumn carrots in late July/August and harvest into December, if you leave them too long into the New Year they will turn woody in the centre and run to seed. Carrot fly is less prevalent later in the season but it is still prudent not to plant into the same space as the early carrots. In my rotation these will go into the space left in my seedbed after planting out my leeks.
