Ministerial Musings

Dear Friends.

I'm writing this on the 70th anniversary of the accession of Queen Elizabeth to the throne. I think for Her Majesty, it is a day of solemn reflection being as much, for her, the anniversary of her beloved father's death as it is about becoming Queen. The street parties and the celebrations (and the extra bank holiday!) will come in a few months' time, but I have enjoyed seeing some pictures and memories of her very long reign.

Like many, the reign of Queen Elizabeth has been the only one I have ever known. I still have the mug all we schoolchildren were given on the occasion of her Silver Jubilee (my goodness, where have those 45 years gone?). And I still remember the slight feeling of disappointment I felt on seeing her wearing a pink hat in the carriage procession on that day. I thought she wore her crown all the time! The papers and the television news have been full of pictures of her long life. There are almost too many to mention but I have seen pictures of the then I7-year-old Princess Elizabeth joining the Auxiliary Territorial Service to do her bit for the war effort as a driver and mechanic. And then looking so pale and resolute—and so, so young—on the day of the coronation when the crown must have seemed so heavy to her.

Of course, in many ways, her life has been one of great privilege. She has never had to worry about having enough to eat or how to scrape together enough to pay the rent. But I believe she is fully aware of that privilege and the struggles of others who are not so fortunate. Perhaps there were times when she wished to be an ordinary wife and mum instead of traveling the world and all the responsibilities her role has entailed. The dramas of her family played out in the press all too publicly remind us that living in a castle or a palace has not spared her from heartache and family breakdown. Surely the Queen worries about her children and grandchildren as much as every other mum and granny. For me, one of the defining pictures of Her Majesty was at the funeral of Prince Philip, where she sat masked and socially-distanced because of Covid, looking so tiny and so vulnerable, mourning the loss of her beloved husband of 73 years. Maybe there would have been grounds for departing from the Covid regulations for the funeral of the Queen's Consort, but I feel sure that the Queen did not wish for that, knowing that many others had not been able to have funerals they wanted for their loved ones either.

Her Majesty made a simple promise at her coronation, which she renewed in her Platinum anniversary message: "that my life will always be devoted to your service." Above all else, she is a lady with an active and real Christian faith.

A phrase from our funeral liturgy comes to me (although I hope it won't be needed for a long time). We often give thanks for our loved ones' "faithfulness in the tasks to which God called them." Her Majesty is not a perfect human being but she has certainly been faithful in the tasks to which God called her. May we all be faithful to whatever tasks God is calling us to today.



News From Your Local Councillors

Loddon High Street: It became necessary for safety reasons to remove some of the parking in the High Street, whilst we have traffic lights on the A146. We have seen an increase in through traffic, as some motorists didn't want to wait in a queue. Lorries were mounting the pavement to pass each other, putting pedestrians and cyclists in danger. Thank you all for your patience during the temporary parking restriction and be assured, things will go back to normal once the roundabout is open, which is only a few weeks away now!

Chedgrave Norwich Road/A146 junction: Following on from my report last month; I now have a meeting scheduled with Norfolk County Highways and the portfolio holder to look at this junction and hopefully, we can come up with some solutions to make it safer.

A146: Last month I was pleased to have fulfilled one of my election pledges. The road at Yelverton was always prone to flooding, requiring temporary traffic lights which caused tailbacks on the A146. Norfolk County Council have now dug out the ditches and piped the road, so the runoff water from neighbouring fields should not cause problems there in the future.



The Chet Valley B-Line is a coalition of local wildlife groups working to improve the habitats for bees, hoverflies, butterflies and other pollinating insects along the Chet from Poringland to the Yare. The continuing loss of pollinators is a conservation disaster and has huge economic consequences for global agriculture.

ARE YOU WILLING TO HELP?

Do you think you could dig over a patch 1-2 m² in your lawn, flower bed or border to plant with a mix of annual and perennial wildflower seeds to attract bees, butterflies, and other insects? Expect Poppy, Borage and Cornflower in year I and Lesser Knapweed. Musk Mallow, Ox Eye Daisy. Red Campion, Native Red Clover, Ribwort Plantain, Salad Burnet, Self-Heal, White Campion, Yellow Rattle year 2 onwards. The packets include full growing instructions, and the seeds are ready mixed with sand to aid sowing.



Loddon and District Local History Group

The January lecture by David Wollweber was fascinating, particularly, as he had researched the information online for his book on the de Argentein family. The surname comes from the place, Argentein, in France and it is probable that Sir Reginald (died 1130) came over to England in the wake of William the Conquerer's success. He was given a manor in Halesworth when he promised to serve the first cup of wine at the coronation banquet which explains why the family shield consisted of three cups on a red background. The family owned a lot of land and not just around Halesworth which they lost at times when one of them fell out with the reigning King but they seemed to get it back again too. They were important men at local and national levels participating in significant events as the life of Sir Richard (1185-1246) demonstrates. He joined the 6th crusade but was captured and imprisoned with twenty other knights until a truce released them. He acquired the manor of Newmarket too and was permitted to set up markets in both Suffolk manors as long as he gave King Henry III two horses a year. Later on, when the barons wanted to reign in the King's expenditure, Sir Richard was one of the signatories on the Magna Carta of 1225 which shows his importance.

Sir Giles (1220-1282) was also a man of influence as he became one of fifteen barons who set up a council to 'reform the realm' in 1258 before he joined Simon de Montfort's rebellion in 1264 which resulted in Henry 111's capture. Sir Giles was appointed to a council of eight to run the country but this was short lived after the barons were defeated at the Battle of Evesham by the future Edward I who decided to rule for his father. As a result of his disloyalty Sir Giles lost a lot of his land but much was returned later on.

The next Sir Giles (1260-1314) had an eventful life too. He took part in Edward I's campaigns and was known as a great knight and crusader but sometimes he made odd judgements such as when he deserted from Edward's army in Scotland in 1302 to go jousting in Surrey. His lands were confiscated and then returned to be confiscated again in 1306 when he deserted once more. In 1310 he went on crusade, was captured and held to ransom on Rhodes. Edward II managed to obtain his release and made him his personal bodyguard. Giles died at the Battle of Bannockburn.

The wife of the next Sir John (1270-1318) made the family even wealthier through a later marriage as she died in 1375 controlling 28 manors. Her son, Sir John (1318-1382), was involved in putting down peasant revolts in Mettingham and Beccles in 1381. He named his illegitimate son, William (1350-1418), as his heir and William continued with the family's military traditions by fighting in the 100 Years' War. He was also involved in stealing wine from the King. The family land eventually passed to the husbands of two female heirs. There is evidence that a Dr John de Argentein (1442-1508) may have been one of the last people to see the Princes in the Tower alive as their doctor. He became the tutor to Prince Arthur, Henry VII's son.

Nature Notes

Where to start? I have had a very interesting January and hopefully I can squeeze it all into this article. At the last moment I decided I would keep a bird year list and to date I have stalled at 118, without travelling that far. Highlights have been a red necked grebe at Ormsby Little Broad which was conveniently posing with a great crested grebe. This enabled those watching them to compare the two species at close quarters. An obliging hawfinch at Sotterley Park, just 30 yards off the road along the permissive footpath to the church, allowed me to get some reasonable photos. While at RSPB Minsmere, as well as a bittern, there was an American wader, a lesser yellow legs, a bird I have only seen twice before. I enjoyed watching the common cranes coming into roost at Stubbs Mill, Hickling along with numerous marsh harriers and three hen harriers. A walk along the north beach at Kessingland produced a flock of around 90 snow buntings along with a solitary shorelark and several "clockwork" sanderlings; I think they are my favourite wader, I love just watching them as they run along the shoreline in their stop start fashion.

Walking along the bank of the Yare during the middle of January, I saw an impressive flock of lapwings on the Cantley side of the river. Looking back upstream I realised that the sky was full of them stretching all the way to Claxton. Walking this stretch in early February, I saw the first local barn owl in six months. There does seem to be a dearth of them this year, borne out by talking with other people. The only other barn owl I have seen this year was at Mundham sitting on a footpath sign right next to the road. Coming home at dusk, my car lights floodlit a little owl trying to move a rat (half its size) out of the road. Initially it flew off, but quickly returned and with much effort dragged the rat off the road up the bank and into a copse. Just hope it didn't try to swallow it! While on the subject of predators and prey, the other day I had a front seat view of a stoat dragging off a rabbit.



Hares are now becoming more obvious in the fields. Thus far we have not seen any *Mad March Hare* antics as the female hare fights off any unwanted suitors. I felt very privileged to watch a water vole swim across a dyke by Hardley Staithe. Growing up in Kent they were a regular sight on the marshes, and the "plop" of them entering the water was a

common occurrence. The mole(s) that in the past have stuck to the front lawn, this year have invaded the back garden; it is fascinating to watch the mole hill erupt as the mole pushes up the next lot of his excavation. March will see the beginning of summer migrants return and we will be serenaded by the chiffchaff again. We will also begin to see more insects about as the weather warms up. Mind you I did see a bumble bee in January in the dunes at Minsmere.

Gardening Notes

From the Allotment

March is **the** time for planting, but the British weather can be very changeable, so you need to vary planting times based on the conditions. Don't rush to plant seeds or tubers if it's frosty or the ground is waterlogged. Wait for the right conditions and the plants will catch up all on their own.

You should be able to continue harvesting rhubarb if you are forcing it. There are special (and expensive pots) on the market for doing this, but you can also succeed using upturned tall plant pots or buckets. Timperley Early is good variety for forcing.

The autumn planted broad beans are well up, but I have had re-sow the spring broad beans in the greenhouse due to mice digging up and eating the seeds. This is the last chance to sow garlic though ideally this should have been planted in late Autumn. My potatoes are chitting and I would like to get the first and second earlies in soon. I know this will expose the growing tips to the inevitable late frosts. I will protect against this by covering them with straw or fleece when a frost is imminent. This is also the time to plant asparagus crowns. They need plenty of space, a sheltered, sunny site with well-drained fertile soil. The crowns should be planted on a raised mound with the roots trailing down the sides. As a perennial you can harvest asparagus for years to come so

it is worth spending time getting the bed right.

Hopefully your gardens have survived the cold winds and rain and you have lots of plans for this year's garden display. Bare-root tree and hedge planting needs to be completed this month. Other jobs to be completed include pruning of shrubs and roses, weeding and mulching, along with sowing annuals, bi-annuals and perennials for summer bedding. Large overgrown clumps of primroses can be split up and replanted, and snowdrops divided whilst still in the green. Daffodils can be deadheaded but leave the stems and leaves to die down naturally and give them a good feed to encourage good flower heads for next year. The sweet peas have survived so no need to resow, although the cupani variety were a lot slower to germinate. The lupins I sowed from seed collected in a friend's garden have produced eight seedlings to plant up; I wonder what colours I get. The chilis and tomatoes are looking good. I will try lettuce this year in the cold frame to protect from pigeons. In pots I will try Bessera elegans known as coral drops, a tender bulb with bright orange flowers and Osteospermum as there are now many colours to choose from. The new tropical border will be planted up with Cannas, Agapanthus and Hedychuim, a ginger lily which is hardy enough to leave in all year.

Most of us have gardens, whether big or small, and I am appealing to you all in the coming year please to be less tidy in them. Leaving areas of grass unmown, planting insect-friendly annuals and buying plants from guaranteed sources, that have not been treated with chemicals, can all help to provide food and breeding areas for all of those creatures at the bottom of the food chain that are so essential to life. If we, together, can use our personal spaces to increase numbers once more, then the birds that we love to watch will increase too as their food supply for young chicks will be abundant once more. Please, when planning your garden this year, consider the many unseen creatures like beetles, wood lice, worms and caterpillars that are vital for life and help them to thrive. Do not poison them with chemical sprays and cleaners, leave moss in the cracks of paths and allow the dandelions and daisies, that we used to see in abundance, to appear once again. It really doesn't have to look a mess and you can control it to suit your needs. Just consider that gardens may be their only haven left in this modern world of concrete and we have it within our power to all. individually, do something about it. Thank you. Carol Webb.
