Ministerial Musings

A quick look at a diary or a calendar for March will show that there are several special days to celebrate or observe. March 1st. is St.David's Day, the patron saint of Wales and March 17th. is St. Patrick's Day, the patron saint of Ireland.

David was born about 500, the grandson of a king. Hebecame a priest and then a bishop. He became a missionary and founded monastries in Wales and England. His last words are reputed to, 'Be joyful, keep the faith, and do the little things that you have heard and seen me do.'

David is the only native born patron saint of the countries of Gt. Britain and Northern Ireland. Ironically, Patrick was also Welsh. He was captered by raiders and taken to Ireland. He was kept as a herdsman for six years beore he managed to escape. Eventually he returned to Ireland preaching the gospel. Both David and Patrick were men of faith who spread the good news throughout the countries of which they became patron saints.

Mothering Sunday this year falls on March 19th. and is the midpoint of the Lenten season. Lent is a period of reflection and self denial before Easter. Half way through on Mothering Sunday, it was traditional for people to return to their mother churches. This custom started during the sixteenth century. As time went on, servants were given the day off to return home, taking wild flowers with them, to give to their mothers.

March 21st. is the Vernal Equinox when the hours of daylight and darkness are the same length. It marks the beginning of Spring. This isn't a religious festival but many people welcome that date as a time in the year which promises more daylight and new growth. It reminds us that the darkness of winter has passed and points us towards the celebration of the new life that Jesus gave us through his death and resurrection.

The total budget was set at \pounds 54,887.50 with the precept being set at \pounds 49,556.00. This equates to approximately \pounds 126.74 per eligible property for the year. The council worked hard to keep the precept to a minimum and reduced or removed expenditure where possible. Unfortunately, all costs are going up significantly and this year's precept reflects that.

Jubilee Bench: You may have noticed the new bench opposite White Horse Plain. This has been purchased to commemorate the life and reign of Queen Elizabeth II and a plaque will soon be added. The parish council purchased the bench partly funded by a grant from the 2022 Jubilee Fete. The bench was kindly installed by NCC Highways as part of the recent works at no cost to the parish council. Thank you to Kay Mason-Billig for organising the installation.

Community Speedwatch: The council agreed to sponsor a Community Speedwatch scheme in the village to help reduce speeding traffic. The scheme will be run by community members and needs 6 volunteers. If you wish to get involved, please contact Bob Demain via <u>chedgravespeedwatch@hotmail.com</u>.

Footway Lighting: The council is investigating switching off council-controlled streetlights in the middle of the night. This will help save on energy use and costs, reduce light pollution and may even have a positive impact on local wildlife.

Easter Egg Hunt: After a break of several years, the Easter Egg Hunt will be back this year! It will take place on Monday 10th April. Look out for further details.

Councillor Resignation: Ronaldgene Lyster resigned from the council in December 2022. The council thanks him for his efforts over the last couple of years. **Councillor Vacancies:** There are two vacancies so please consider getting involved – the same few people can only do so much to keep your village the pleasant place it is. You are welcome to attend meetings to find out what the council does and get a feel for things.





Loddon and District Local History Group

Mary Fewster visited the history group in December to talk about the Goldsmiths of East Anglia between 1550 and the end of the 1700s. Even those working in silver were called goldsmiths. These master craftsmen operated in the cities of Norwich, Ipswich, Bury St Edmunds, Kings Lynn, Beccles and Great Yarmouth as these were on main trade routes and likely to have visitors. London was the only place where hallmarks were used until around 1565 so identifying the workshops of items before that is difficult. Their product was a luxury trade for the top levels of society and In Norwich the 'gold' area for workshops and shops was found on the north end of the market place and what is now London Street reaching to Tombland.

Mary proceeded to discuss some individual goldsmiths starting with John Bassingham who worked in London Street until he died in 1569. The gateway of his house still survives with his coat of arms featuring 2 cups and 2 lions on the Guildhall. Mary added that having your own coat of arms was not uncommon for goldsmiths. John would have had apprentices as standards had to be high and any substandard silver could be confiscated or broken. Although goldsmiths were important people they were rarely mayors probably because they were too busy and the group in Norwich tended to intermarry with widows often marrying another goldsmith.

The Reformation helps to identify individuals and their work. All chalices had to be replaced by something in the style of drinking vessels with simple designs and no patterns. In 1565 Norwich started to use the hallmark of a castle and lion (for the place) and then an individual mark for each goldsmith. Peter Mancroft's 'Peterson' cup was made by William Cobbold who was one of the finest Tudor goldsmiths. In Norfolk there were around 700 parishes who needed new communion cups and many had weights scratched onto them. Flagons and communion plates were made later on.

Norwich corporation was also building up their silver collection. Cobbold made a piece to hold salt and the scabbard on the civic sword was replaced but smaller, cheaper items like thimbles and buttons were being made too for tradesmen. Silver spoons started to be given as presents for a wedding or christening.

Later goldsmiths became retailers of luxury goods like London plate so less is known about them. Now about 70 pieces of non church silver from this time period is left and around 300 communion cups. A fascinating lecture.

Read Any Good Books Lately?

Superhero Mum by Timothy Knapman, illustrated by Joe Berger

Mother's Day is close so what could be nicer than a picture book celebrating your superhero mum?! Its retro Pop Art-style this playground-chasing, cake-making, teddy-finding, bubble-bearded Supermum is great fun!

Four Thousand Weeks: Time Management for Mortals by Oliver Burkeman

If you live until eighty you'll live for just over four thousand weeks – it doesn't seem very long put like that! This humorous, yet surprisingly practical book draws on ancient and contemporary philosophers, psychologists and spiritual teachers. It's a thoughtful book which made me dwell on how I spend my time and what I prioritise. Well worth a read in my opinion!

For Thy Great Pain Have Mercy on My Little Pain by Victoria Mackenzie

I read this in one sitting! It's not that long but it's a wonderful first novel about Dame Julian of Norwich, an anchoress, who chose to live a life of prayer and contemplation shut up alone in a cell (literally anchored to the church) and of Margery Kempe of Kings Lynn, a mystic. It tells their lifer stories separately and culminates in their meeting. It's such a wonderfully imagined book and shines a light on these two extraordinary women. Revelations of Divine Love by Julian of Norwich is the earliest surviving book in English written by a woman and The Book of Margery Kempe is the first autobiography written in English, by man or woman. Together these books are two of the most important books written in the medieval period.

The Women of Troy by Pat Barker

This follows up from her previous book The Silence of the Girls, a daring retelling of The Iliad from the perspective of the women of Troy who endured the war. I've never properly managed to get into reading Greek myths, even retellings, but Pat Barker is so good at breathing life into them and making you really empathise with the characters.

I am trying to read...

A Little Life by Hanya Yanagihara – It's just very long! It's brilliant though and I am partly trying to read it so I can go to see the production at the National Theatre in May. It follows four young graduates in New York and their seemingly at first, carefree lives. As the novel goes on it darkens and although I haven't got to the point yet it apparently becomes a shattering and difficult read, albeit it a compelling one! **Ruth Redford**

Nature Notes

It's the 7th of Feb and I have less than 24 hours to get this in. I developed a heavy cold last week, it's now a chest infection and I'm coughing a lot and very breathless. I had a phone consultation with a GP and a prescription yesterday. So does spending time out in the natural world help you snap out of struggling to breathe and feeling sorry for yourself, the honest answer I can give is yes, it lifts my mood and walking slowly helps my breathing. A sunny though cold day has helped. My early morning short dog walk was breath taking (no pun intended). Frost on the reeds, Robins, Woodpigeons and Collard Doves cooing, then I heard my first Song Thrush of the year followed by a Chaffinch, it just reset my day. Having excused myself from doing my usual trip to Seething I was able to take the dogs out earlier than usual. Parking near the entrance to Hardley Hall we set off down the track to the river Chet. By the time we had reached the river I had already seen or heard 25 different bird species. Even though I was having to stop regularly to catch my breath it was fantastic to be out in this beautiful countryside. I had walked about two thirds of the way to Hardley Cross, when I felt I ought to turn back. Although my bird count had only increase by two, I wasn't disappointed, the enjoyment of being out in this glorious place, had given my spirit a fantastic lift. What do they say about a glass half full or half empty, well I just thank God I have a glass! On the short distance home I saw something white at the edge of the road only to discover it was the underside of a Stoat disappearing into the hedge, awesome.

Overall January has been a good month with many highlights, seeing a Bittern fly across the Yare and land in the reeds of the duck pits just upstream of Hardley Staithe and a Great White Egret, once extremely rare in this country.

An enjoyable trip with a friend, firstly to Reydon, outside Southwell, where four Waxwings had been seen. Not finding them at first we headed on to Hen Reed Bed, but then we noticed four starling sized birds, and sure enough there were the four Waxwings giving us good views in poor light. Our walk at Hen Reed Bed looking out over the mudflats of the Blythe Estuary was very productive as well, with lots of waders and ducks on view. We found a Spotted Redshank, it's distinct call separating it from some calling Redshank. Spotted Redshanks are usually Spring and Autumn visitors though some obviously over winter as this one was. I am still coughing but very much buoyed up by my exhilarating slow walk this morning. As well as being distracted every time I see movement in the trees outside my window. Creation can have a very positive impact on our lives if we will only let it.

Gardening Notes

From the Allotment

... February is an in-between sort of a month, but March is really when things get going. As I write in early Feb my allotment in Hardley Road with its sandy soil is quite dry, despite the rain we had over the winter, so I'm hoping for rain soon.

I set my potatoes to chit on the 1st Feb, a week earlier than last year and have decided to only grow first and second earlies, hoping for another mild spring, and because last years main crop was so reduced by the drought. We are still eating the Charlotte second earlies left from last year. If you haven't started your potatoes chitting then there is still time and, in fact, if necessary, you can miss out chitting and just plant them. They'll just be a bit slower coming through. Loddon Garden and DIY have a good selection but do tend to sell out.

Loddon Garden also sell loose onion sets and shallot sets which are both cheaper than other garden centres and don't have lots of unnecessary packaging.

Now is also a good time to plant spring broad beans directly into the soil though you can start them off on a windowsill or in the greenhouse first. February is really the last time to plant aubergine seed if growing the plants yourself as they require a long growing season. I tried keeping an aubergine plant indoors over winter hoping the last large fruit would ripen. It didn't and is now compost! **Andrew Milner**

From the Garden

The year has got off to a very cold start so hopefully the dahlias I left in the ground have survived. I will leave checking until I am sure the frosts have finished. I have joined the Norfolk and Suffolk Dahlia Society to learn more about growing dahlias and hopefully I will remember to stake them early. We haven't had much rain as I write this in early February and the pond will need to be topped up if it doesn't rain soon. We planted a few new native trees between the wood and garden, so we need to check they are watered well for this first year. Bare root tree and hedge planting needs to be completed this month or left until the autumn. Jobs for this month include pruning, weeding and mulching and if you didn't do it in the autumn clean and tidy your greenhouse before it gets full of seedings and new plants. Large clumps of snowdrops can be divided whilst still in the green, they will multiply back up in a couple of years. Deadhead daffodils but leave the stems and leaves to die down naturally, give them a good feed to encourage good flower heads for next year. The Bessera Elgans I planted last year didn't really perform so I will try them in pots. The deer's favourite plants will move into the new planters in the front drive, then I will have room for more Dahlias. Happy Gardening. Shirley Cross

A MEMORY OF THE 1953 FLOODS

There has been a lot in the Eastern Daily Press recently about the floods 70 years ago in January 1953. Just a short piece to let you know I was there at the age of 8, my sister was 6. There were no significant warnings so we woke up to the devastation of everything under water,

Our family escaped to London and were looked after for 3 weeks by our Grandad

He took us and mum around the sights of London. Dad went back to Canvey next day. The Army were there to sand bag the sea wall and after a few days the water went down leaving brown liquid mud.

I didn't know until moving to Norfolk how badly this county was affected too.

Canvey children went back to school after six weeks away, we were told little, probably because there was no proper sea wall built for a few years when the old sea wall was extensively rebuilt and shuttered at the top. It could have happened again.

159 people died including children whose beds and cots were under water level.

It happened at night with no warnings. If we children were told anything, it was to try and forget it and move on! Seeing some of them, including my friend at school who had lost her baby sister, it wasn't an easy thing to do. It was years later before the church started having memorial events. photographs, talking about memories and so on. **Daphne Gibson**
