Ministerial Musings

Once again, it is the season of remembrance. November 1 st is All Saints'Day, and November 2 nd. All Souls' Day. Then November 11 th. the day when the fighting stopped in 1918, when we remember the war dead. There are war cemeteries all over the world, cared for by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission. Amongst the graves there are many headstones marked to an unknown soldier with the inscription, "Known Unto God". Many cemeteries have huge walls where thousands of names are inscribed. These are the missing who have no known grave. The names of twenty two men from our local villages can be found amongst them.

One of the graves marked as a pilot of WW2 was in Staplehurst Churchyard in Kent. The crash site of this pilot was known and was excavated twice. On the second attempt, a watch was found and was identified by the pilot's sister as belonging to Flight Lieutenant Frederick Rushmer. His grave is now marked by a headstone bearing his name and other details. He is no longer missing. Eighty three years ago the Battle of Britain raged in the skies over England. At the moment of writing there is only one of "The Few" left alive and he's 103. Flight Lieutenant Rushmer, was killed on September 5 th . He's a local man and he's remembered on the Thurlton Memorial because his family lived there. But he was born in Sisland, almost certainly in Lodge Farm.

Missing, alive or dead, all of us are known unto God because he made us and loves us. The Psalmist wrote, "The LORD will keep your going out and your coming in from this time forth and for evermore." (Ps. 121:8)

The prophet Isaiah reminds us that all are precious to God when he said, So once again we gather to remember and to remind ourselves that God doesn't forget.

News From Your Local Councillors



More Housebuilding-After my report last month about South Norfolk having a 5-year land supply again, protecting the Town from speculative developments, the House of Lords overturned the lifting of the Nutrient Neutrality rules, so we are back to square one. No one wants the waterways polluted BUT we must tackle ALL polluters, the main culprits being the sewage outfalls and farming. House builders are being singled out unfairly, which stops all development in those areas affected. The knock-on effect is not just a shortage of new houses and contractors going out of business, but our places being subject to planning applications outside of where they would normally be allowed. We will continue to resist attempts to dump all this new housing in our area but until the law is changed, we are at risk.

Bad Parking -The problem never goes away, does it? This is a plea for those who want to park to use designated car parks. They're free for at least the first hour, and we have two of them, so there is no excuse. There is also on street parking where it's appropriate. But, there are still those who would rather abandon their cars on double yellow lines and block the road because they're "only going to be a minute". I unfortunately witnessed one such driver parking across the entrance to the Marina the other day to get a takeaway. This caused a total blockage as one car was trying to turn into the Marina, one was trying to come out and someone else was just trying to drive past. On pointing out the free car park to the offender, I was given a mouthful of abuse. Is it too much to ask for some thought when parking? Oh, and don't get me started on speeding through the villages!

Dog Poo: The damaged dog poo bin near Big Back Lane has been reinstated a short distance from its old position. Please use it! Thank you.



Notes from Sisland

When you read this, Sisland church will just have held an autumn coffee morning/book sale, on Saturday 21st October. We would like to thank everyone who was able to support us as we continue to raise funds to maintain the church fabric. The changing season also brings the change of service times for Sisland. With the change of clocks on 29th October the service of evening Prayer moves to 4pm, during the summer it has been at 5pm. A traditional service using the Book of Common Prayer it is an excellent way to reflect on the week past and prepare for the week ahead.



As we enter the autumn season, the weather definitely changeable, our attention turns to a period of reflection and remembrance. Remembrance Day has been observed every year since 1919. As well as standing together in Remembrance on II November, we also observe a two-minute silence at I I am on Remembrance Sunday. The former, originally called "Armistice Day", was instigated to commemorate the armistice agreement that ended the First World War on Monday, November II, 1918, at II a.m.—on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. For those who know Sisland church you will be aware that there is no war memorial in either the building or the churchyard, but the act of remembrance is still important.

With no specific memorial, villages are often touched indirectly. Flight Lieutenant Frederick William Rushmer was lost after combat over Biggin Hill on 5th September 1940. Born in Sisland on 12th April 1910, son of Henry and Annie Rushmer, he was 30 years old when he died. Originally in an unmarked grave, following investigation his final resting place is in All Saints churchyard, Staplehurst, Kent.

Sisland Church will continue to be open during the autumn, even if the door is closed it will be unlocked, so please take the opportunity to visit us if passing, for a moment of reflection. **Rowena Bryce** (Churchwarden, St Mary's, Sisland).





Loddon and District Local History Group

Dr Joy Hawkins - 'Stones, Bones and Herbs.' Treating Everyday Ailments in Medieval England.' (September lecture)

> Firstly, Dr Hawkins explained how the medieval period explained illness in religious terms. No illnesses were believed to have been present in the Garden of Eden until Eve was tempted and then disease, infection and old age kicked in but it was not thought that God was revengeful if people repented. Medieval people thought they should accept pain in order to get into heaven and the church exploited this to make money suggesting I day of pain meant 40 days had been avoided in purgatory. Tied in with these religious beliefs were the Ancient Greeks' ideas on the 4 Humours or Fluids - blood, phlegm, yellow and black bile - and various foods, herbs, stones and metals were thought to be effective in balancing these components out. It was also believed that colours were significant and the best ones to use were blue, expensive and associated with the Virgin Mary, and green.

Dr Hawkins referred to the 'Midland Jewel' several times to illustrate beliefs of the time. This object contains some details of 15th century treatment and may have been owned by the wife of Richard Neville, known as the kingmaker. It was made of gold decorated with a blue sapphire and contains words and religious engravings like the nativity and crucifixion. She also mentioned other artefacts like 'The Coventry Ring' which depicts the 5 wounds of Christ and pilgrim badges which were worn on hats by people going on a pilgrimage. Sometimes these were hung around doors too to protect the inhabitants.

The talk moved on to treatments people could access. Urban areas had apothecaries and Norwich had 35 just in the market area but most people lived in the countryside where knowledge was passed down. Many plants were used for specific problems: mint for travel sickness; blackberries for sore throats and mouth ulcers; camomile for sleep but the plant that was used for everything was rosemary which was thought good for the spirits, headaches, energy and useful as an anaesthetic.

Dr Hawkins finished this fascinating talk by explaining how the medieval period saw heaven as a perfect garden containing herbs, clean water and good food.

Read Any Good Books Lately?

On Beauty by Zadie Smith

The recent publication of Zadie Smith's latest book, The Fraud, was a good prompt to go back and read what many consider to be her finest novel, 2005's On Beauty, a loose adaptation of E.M. Forster's Howard's End, but set in north London and an East Coast Ivy League university near Boston. What really struck me while reading On Beauty is how it explored a lot of the issues surrounding the "culture war" long before they became fashionable in the media. Smith's writing is typically sharp, funny and insightful, and in the character of Kiki we have a person of warmth, humanity and moderation amid all the foolishness.

The Blackbird by Tim Weaver

This is crime fiction at its most pacy! A great read which gallops through a plot, from London to Northumberland, and introduces many twists and turns on the way. The premise is a couple have vanished from their car after it tumbles down a ravine, they must be dead, but where are their bodies? Enter David Raker, private investigator and thorn in the side of various police departments.

A Man Called Ove by Fredrik Backman

Ove is almost certainly the grumpiest man you will ever meet. He thinks himself surrounded by idiots – neighbours who can't reverse a trailer properly, joggers, shop assistants who talk in code. Ove's wife has died, and life now seems pointless, but as he unexpectedly starts on a journey of discovery around his own neighbourhood, he gets to know the people living within it. He uncovers not only some wonderful things about the people he's always silently judged, but also about himself

The Time Traveller's Guide To Elizabethan England by Ian Mortimer

This is a fantastic introduction and very accessible guide to Elizabethan England. Written as if you were going to be visiting as a tourist, Mortimer whisks you back in time to Elizabethan England and takes you on a journey throughout that period. At first Mortimer gives us an overview of general society, and then the basic elements that are needed to survive in that society, from the language and shopping to the travel arrangements and clothes.

Spanning the 1950s to the 1990s and from the Deep South to California, Bennett's stunning novel follows the journeys of two estranged twin sisters leading very different lives – to the extent of adopting different racial identities.

Nature Notes

I began November's Nature Notes in mid-September, trying to be more organised, I expect September's good weather will be a distant memory as you read this. Walking the dogs over the past days, it is noticeable that there are still plenty of Swallows skimming over fields feeding on insects as they get ready to migrate. Also, the *hueet* contact call of Chiff Chaffs seems to resonate from every tree, occasionally breaking into their more recognizable "chiff chaff" song.

It's now October 3rd and Swallows seem to have left for warmer climes, but I am still hearing the contact calls of Chiff Chaffs. Back in September at Seething, I could see two birds perched on overhead wires some 70 metres ahead of me. One was obviously a Woodpigeon, but the second bird was smaller. I got closer without disturbing them and could see that the second bird was a dove. It then started its purring call before flying off revealing its obvious tail pattern. It was a Turtle Dove; this is the first time I had seen one at this location in four years. Later that evening, I went out to fill our bird feeders only to discover a young Hedgehog feeding under them, but when I returned to re-hang the full feeders it had been joined by one of its parents which was noticeably much bigger.

Walking the dogs up our road, I saw lots of movement on a small bank and on closer inspection was amazed to see loads of one of the species of miner bees enjoying the morning sunshine. I noticed loads of small circular holes each with a pile of fine earth at their entrance. The penny dropped and I realised that I was witnessing these bees emerging into the world for the first time. Continuing up the road I was suddenly saw movement in the middle of a stubble field. I strained my eyes to see if I could make out what it was. It's a mammal, but too large and the wrong colouration for a Stoat. The mystery mammal was heading straight for me. It stopped right in front of me, gave a loud squeal, which alerted both my dogs to its presence, and shot across the road into the field behind me. What was it? Well, its face markings and colour meant it was a Polecat Ferret.

Mentioning a Stoat I did see one a few days later, running in and out of the grass verge for some 30 meters, giving me good views. Fortunately, both my dogs were not very observant that day so missed it. Earlier on the same walk along a track between the fields as I approached a large puddle, two Common Snipe took flight and zig zagged into the distance.

Raking some grass recently, I became aware of the movement of a black beetle which kept raising its tail in the manner of a scorpion, I immediately knew it was a Devil's Coach Horse beetle.

As Autumn turns into winter there will be still a lot to see. I am still waiting for the arrival of Pink Footed Geese and the two winter thrushes, Fieldfares and Redwing.

So, wrap up warm and enjoy the wonderful creation that is all around us.

Allotment & Gardening Notes

From the Allotment

The weather continues warm and this has extended the ripening season. I am still picking autumn raspberries, apples, squashes, courgettes and more surprisingly radish outside and tomatoes, peppers, chillies, and aubergine in the polytunnel. Raspberries have a long growing season with summer varieties — early, mid and late — and then autumn varieties. These are pruned differently the old canes on summer raspberries are removed and new canes tied in, so you need to prune before the leaves fall so you can tell the difference between old and new. Autumn varieties are cut down to ground and have more bushy habit so don't need supporting. The leeks, cabbages and parsnips are ready to start eating, but there are a lot of squashes to get through first.

The grape harvest from 4 vines yielded 15 litres of juice now fermenting nicely in my garage. I grow my grapes on the Double Guyot system which maximises the grape production though it requires more pruning.

My avid reader may recall the 'melon challenge' this year. I won, my opponent Joe's melon plant died. I let two melons to grow on the single plant and removed other flowers; one was delicious, the other went over while I rashly had a week's holiday. November is the time to look ahead. clear away the things that are over, plan your crops, prepare the ground for next year and begin planting those crops that go in now like garlic, broad beans and winter onions.

From the Garden

I'm writing at the beginning of October, the weather is warm and I am preparing a new flower bed as the gravel parking area has been completed. The bed will be shaded in the morning but sunny in the afternoon. It borders the woodland so will be planted up with two small trees (liquidambar for its autumn colour and an Acer) shrubs (Viburnum, Dogwood, Euonymus and Lavatera) Foxgloves, primroses, sweet violet and hellebores. I will add daffodils, bluebells, snowdrops and pink Lily of the Valley, if I can find it. We have lost several oak trees in the last 2 years due to disease, probably not helped by our light stoney soil and the current hot summers, we will replant a more suitable tree. The climate is definitely changing, it is not spring, yet we have the following flowering, Primrose, cowslip and lupin, has anyone else noticed this in their garden? Jobs for this month include planting bulbs and bedding plants to provide a spring display, dividing perennials to provide you with more plants or to swap with a friend, moving tender plants into the greenhouse or shed for the winter. Hedges or bare root trees are best planted between November and March depending on the weather. I am starting my sweet peas off early this year, sowing the seed in October and planting out before Christmas. The seed catalogues will start arriving soon, what will you grow for next year?
